New business

Gayle Hyde moved and Denise Raeder seconded that ribbons be used for all chambers to designate the various chambers. Unanimous vote.

Gayle Hyde moved and Brian Geffre seconded that the NDHSAA go back to the flat team plaque rather than the book style of the current plaque. We recommend to return to the plaque in the shape of ND. Unanimous vote.

Coaches' clinic - MVP – Do we need to put back into the rules clinic the instruction of how to register for state congress. Discussion included that including it on the PowerPoint will not

facilitate this. MVP is not user friendly. The discussion surrounded that help is needed, but no one had a solution for what would be the best solution.

Yvonne Kalka moved that schools must evenly distribute the resolutions submitted across all committees. No more than 1 resolution per committee unless the school has more than four students in the chamber. Angela Cunningham seconded. Motion failed unanimously

Denise Raeder moved and Eydie Wagar seconded that at schools at invitational tournaments can run a student for presiding officer in each of the chambers. At state schools can run only five presiding officers at the state tournament.

Editing issues in the regulations --- The advisory board will edit the regulations so they are consistent with current policy.

Anessa Pfeifer-Johnson moved and Gayle Hyde seconded to strike p. 5 rule 4. (outdated bill). Motion carried unanimously

Gayle Hyde moves and Brian Bubach seconded that Parliamentary Procedure Review p. 6 number 2 to read, "All chambers may suspend the rules to allow a **ONE MINUTE** questioning period after each speech so that there will be no interruption during a speech on a resolution/bill." (the addition is one minute). Motion carried unanimously
