MINUTES
North Dakota High School Activities Association
August 2, 2012, Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held their meeting on August 2, 2012 in Valley City. President Ulland called the meeting to order at 9:45 a.m. with all members present. President Ulland welcomed the new board members as they introduced themselves followed by returning Board members, executive staff and executive assistants.

Following additions and deletions, motion by Ham to approve the agenda. Second by Olson and carried unanimously.

The Board was previously supplied the minutes of the June 19-20, 2012 and June 27, 2012 meetings for review. Motion by Sanstead to approve the June 19-20, 2012 minutes as read. Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Helvik to approve the June 27, 2012 minutes as read. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary presented the financial report beginning with the 2011-2012 year-end balance sheet, detailed budget and investment report which was made available prior to the meeting for review. Harold Rotunda will appear before the Board later in the meeting to report on the audit for the 2011-2012 year. Motion by Helvik to approve the year-end report. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary reviewed the spring sport financial report and the Fine Arts financial report for 2011/12.

8. Kensal and Carrington in football, 2012/13

Tom Tracy, Superintendent of Kensal Public Schools discussed the dissolution of their current football coop with Carrington beginning in the 2012/13 school year. Carrington HS was not opposed to the dissolution, however concern was shown for the disregard of the existing football plan and guidelines. Kensal has two students that have been participating in the Kensal-Carrington football coop. One student would like to participate in Jamestown the other student has moved to Carrington.

A motion to deny the coop dissolution request was made by Ham. Second by Olson. A roll call vote was taken. Olson – yes, Auch - yes, Brannan- yes, Hall – yes, Ham – Yes, Helvik – yes, Martin – yes, Roaldson – yes, Sanstead – yes, Wiberg – yes, Ulland – yes. Motion to deny the coop dissolution carried unanimously.

For further review of the Financial Report, the Executive Secretary introduced Harold Rotunda to report on the audit for the 2011-2012 year. Motion by Helvik to approve the report. Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

Executive Board report was presented by President Ulland. The Executive Board met to determine whether or not a football coop application between Kensal & Jamestown for 2012/13 should be considered by the Board. Consideration of the proposed coop was denied by the Executive Board.

A request for a coop between Larimore and Dakota Prairie in boys' and girls' cross country was considered and denied by the Executive Board. Motion by Helvik to approve Executive Board report. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

West region tournament sites were discussed. At the June 19-20, 2012 Board meeting, Jeff Dornfeld, AD Williston High School asked to have until the August Board meeting to determine whether or not they would be able to host the West Region Wrestling Tournament in 2012-13. A letter from Jeff Dornfeld was presented stating Williston will not be able to hold the West Region Wrestling Tournament due to a shortage of hotel rooms. The West Region Athletic Directors recommended moving the tournament to Minot, the next place on their rotation schedule. Motion by Ham to move the 2012-13 West Region Wrestling Tournament to Minot. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

A recommendation was received from the West Region Athletic Directors to move the 2012-13 West Region Volleyball Tournament to Mandan. An invitation was received from Mandan. Motion by Auch to move the 2012/13 West Region Volleyball Tournament to Mandan. Second by Sanstead. Motion carried unanimously.

Hall provided a report from the Constitution & By-Laws Committee on the strategic plan items to be reviewed by the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. An October 1st meeting has been set to determine a new format and to continue work on by-laws. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Helvik. Second by Brannan. Motion carried unanimously.

Helvik provided a report from the Media Committee on the television contract and strategic plan items. The current television contract expires at the end of the 2012/13 year. The committee will continue to work on procuring a new contract. Chuck Schmidt, a staff member from the Arizona Interscholastic Association will be invited to ND to share what AZ is doing with webcasting. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Auch. Second by Brannan. Motion carried unanimously.

Ham provided a report from the Finance Committee to the Board regarding their discussion of the strategic plan. Pursuing additional corporate sponsorships is an ongoing task, keeping in mind we need to assure our current sponsors contracts are honored. We are in the first year of a 5 year contract with our Premiere sponsor. The committee recommended establishing a purpose for a foundation before any additional plans are made to create an NDHSAA Foundation. The committee discussed the strategic planning committee's recommendation regarding the addition of a media specialist. With the proposed changes being made with webcasting it may be possible to hire a media manager/specialist in the future. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Sanstead. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

Olson provided a Realignment Committee Report with timeline recommendations for appropriate items in the strategic plan. Timelines for Strategic Goal 2 concerning Enrollment – classification – criteria for coops are all ongoing. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Martin. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

Martin provided an Officials Committee Report with timeline recommendation for appropriate items in the strategic plan. Elimination of goal 4 step 2 was recommended and will be reviewed with the NDHSAA Strategic Plan Draft 3. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Ham. Second by Sanstead. Motion carried unanimously.

Brannan provided a Fine Arts Committee Report including a timeline recommendation for appropriate items in the strategic plan. The committee will review and evaluate ways to reduce expenditures and

increase revenues for Fine Arts activities, gather feedback and implement changes as per the proposed timeline. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Helvik. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

Auch provided a Promotions and Programs Committee Report and a timeline recommendation for appropriate items in the strategic plan. Recommendations are to request schools create videos on sportsmanship, create new pre-game and game sportsmanship announcements, create public service announcements (PSA) to recruit officials. Removal of reference to coaches was recommended and will be reviewed with the NDHSAA Strategic Plan Draft 3. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Martin. Second by Sanstead. Motion carried unanimously.

Wiberg provided a Tournament Committee Report and a timeline recommendation for appropriate items in the strategic plan. Reference to locations and profitability are recommended to be directed to the Combined Tournament Committee in December 2012. Recommendation to eliminate goal 2, step 5 will be reviewed with the NDHSAA Strategic Plan Draft 3. Timelines for the strategic plan were stated and added to the overall plan draft. Motion to approve the committee report by Brannan. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

Strategic Plan general timelines were recommended and approved as follows:

- i. August—Board approve Committee Assignments
- ii. August—Committees meet to approve or make changes and develop timelines
- iii. September—Board approves what is to be presented to membership
- iv. September—Survey member schools for feedback
Use Survey Monkey for feedback on each goal
- v. October—Make adjustments and present to membership as draft
- vi. November—Final approval of strategic plan

Staff member Bubach reported Bismarck State College has indicated a willingness to host Class B State Music in 2014 and 2015. Motion to approve Bismarck State College as State Class B Music site for 2014 and 2015 by Sanstead. Second by Helvik. Motion carried unanimously.

A request from Grand Forks Red River HS regarding a student being allowed to compete in a similar athletic contest during the high school season of that sport was reviewed. NDHSAA By-Laws allow the Board to approve this as long as there are Olympic or International ramifications. Motion to approve by Sanstead. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

Coaches' Education requirements were reviewed. A motion by Olson to add "a coaching fundamentals course while in college" and strike "within the last 2 years" from the coaches certified permit requirements. Second by Helvik. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion on fines outlined in the NDHSAA Coaches Certified Permit Requirements resulted in a motion by Ham to amend permit requirement note #3 to Non-Completion of certification; the respective school will receive a warning for the first offense. Each subsequent offence results in a \$200 fine for the school for each violation. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Brannan to amend permit requirements note #2 to "Coaches who graduated from college with a coaching minor which included Fundamentals of Coaching, First Aid, CPR/AED and Concussion Management within five years of the application for the permit will be given a Coaching Permit. Second by Sanstead. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary reported that participation surveys were included in Board packets. Sylling will be attending the NFHS Summer Conference planning committee meeting on August 19-21, 2012. Any suggestions of improvements to the summer conference should be directed to Sylling before that date.

Sylling reported Derrick Dixon was approved by the NFHS and named to the national wrestling rules committee and Traci Heisler was approved by the NFHS and named to the national track & field rules committee.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 18, 2012 at the NDHSAA office in Valley City.

President Ulland declared the meeting adjourned.

September 9, 2012 – Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota Officials Association held their meeting on September 9, 2012 in Valley City. President Huber called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm with Richard Peterson, Mike Anderson, Brad Nold, Larry Grondahl, Scott Privratsky, and Jason Dockter attending.

Privratsky moved to approve agenda. Second by Dockter and carried unanimously.

The Board was previously supplied the minutes of the March 22, 2011 meeting for review. Grondahl moved to approve minutes as read. Second by Anderson and carried unanimously.

Current board terms were reviewed. President Huber's second and final board term will end July 31, 2013. A replacement will be elected from either the Southwest or Northeast quadrant. Grondahl's first term will end July 31, 2013 and he will be eligible for re-election. Peterson moved to have Huber and Grondahl again represent the NDOA Board on the nominating committee. Second by Nold and motion carried unanimously.

Action items from the previous meeting were reviewed. The following items will be reported to the NDHSAA Board of Directors meeting on September 18, 2012 and action will be taken at their October 2012 meeting:

- b) Contract three additional state basketball tournament officials and increase the sit out number to 4 years
- c) Contract four additional state wrestling tournament officials to assistant referee

State Active Official Awards – Baseball, Patrick Adair, Lisbon; Boys' Basketball, Troy Huber, Dickinson; Girls' Basketball, Lynn Gress, Bismarck; Football, Wayne Gripentrog, Wahpeton; Gymnastics, Kim Ressler, Minot; Hockey, Matthew Spivey, Grand Forks; Soccer, Scott Poling, Larimore; Swimming, Matthew Goehner, Jamestown; Volleyball, James Stallard, Grand Forks; Wrestling, Jeb Williams, Bismarck; Softball, Elliott Gerhardt, Bismarck. Dockter moved to accept the Active Officials' Awards. Second by Peterson and motion carried unanimously.

The Officials' Game Fees schedule was discussed. Anderson moved a two-year officials' fee schedule for 2013-14 and 2014-15 be set, with all sports increased 4% for 2013-14 and then locked in for 2014-15. Second by Peterson and motion carried unanimously.

Grondahl moved that a JV hockey rate for games with 17-minute periods of \$50.00 be added to the officials' fee schedule. Nold seconded and motion carried unanimously.

NDOA Hall of Fame Nominations were reviewed. Grondahl moved to allow NDOA Board the option of inducting up to five (5) inductees each year with a sixth inductee possible though a unanimous vote of the board. Seconded by Dockter and motion carried unanimously.

Secretary Fetsch reported on ongoing negotiations with various online film exchange companies to find make online film available to registered football and basketball officials. Registered officials will be notified via MVP if/when access becomes available.

The following topics were discussed with no action taken. They will be reviewed at the spring meeting:

- a) Requiring officials to apply for region basketball tournaments as part of their online registration
- b) Increasing registration fees to make online credit card payments an option when registering
- c) 2" striped shirts for football officials
- d) Replacing the 25-year service pins with something different

3. Coop applications for three Grand Forks Valley Middle School and Manvel coops were considered and the Executive Board denied forwarding to the entire board due to of coop deadline non-compliance. The cooperative sponsorship agreements not sent to the Board included wrestling, volleyball and gymnastics.

Motion by Martin to approve Executive Board report. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

Manvel Public School requested waiver of the \$500 late fee for the Grand Forks Valley Middle-Manvel coop in Boys' Basketball, 7-8, 2012-13. Motion by Helvik to deny waiver of late fee for boys' basketball coop. Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

Charles Strand, Supt. of Our Redeemer's HS appeared before the Board to appeal a hardship denial by the Executive Secretary. The hardship application, notice of hardship ruling and a letter from Charles Strand were presented and reviewed. Executive Secretary Sylling provided a report of his hardship investigation. Mr. Strand provided additional information concerning the hardship. Motion made by Ham to uphold the Executive Secretary's decision to deny the hardship. Second by Martin. A roll call vote was taken. Olson – yes, Auch - yes, Brannan- yes, Hall – yes, Ham – yes, Helvik – yes, Martin – yes, Roaldson – yes, Sanstead – yes, Wiberg – yes, Ulland – yes. Motion to uphold the Executive Secretary's decision to deny the hardship carried unanimously.

Strategic Plan Draft 3 as determined at the last Board meeting along with a sample survey for member schools was presented. Motion by Roaldson to approve survey presented and authorize electronic distribution to Class A Athletic Directors and Class B Superintendents. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously

General timelines for strategic plan implementation as agreed upon are as follows:

- August or Sept.—Board approves what is to be presented to membership
- September—survey member schools for feedback

October—make adjustments and present to membership
November—final approval of strategic plan

Helvik provided a report from the Media Committee on the television contract. The current television contract expires at the end of the 2012/13 year. The committee reviewed the existing television contract. Items discussed included web-streaming, changing web-streaming wording and timeline. The importance of issuing the contract to someone who can do state-wide broadcast was discussed. There was also discussion on webcasting vs pay per view. Request for review will be added to the agenda of the combined tournament committee meeting in December 2012 for recommendation. Tournament committee recommendation will be considered at the January Board meeting.

NDOA Report was given by NDOA secretary Matt Fetsch. The NDOA Board met September 9th in Valley City and discussed issues regarding regulation of officiating. All NDOA recommendations were reviewed. Motion to approve football committee report by Helvik. Second by Auch to approve FB report. Motion carried unanimously.

General Assembly Meeting
North Dakota High School Activities Association
October 18, 2012 - Bismarck, ND

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramkota Inn on October 18, 2012. President Ulland called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

President Ulland welcomed member schools to the NDHSAA General Assembly. He thanked all for what they do for the students of North Dakota. If not for the support and hard work of the people in this room, this association would not be able to be what they are today.

President Ulland declared a quorum.

President Ulland introduced the NDHSAA Board of Directors and staff.

The minutes of the October, 2011 General Assembly Meeting were addressed. Motion by Matt Herman, Ellendale to approve the minutes. Second by Jack Maus, Grafton. Motion carried.

The minutes of January, 2012 Membership Meeting were addressed. Motion by Lorell Jungling, Mandan, to approve the minutes. Second by Kevin Rogers, Hatton. Motion carried.

Board member Olson presented the 2013 and 2014 football plan as approved by the Board of Directors on October 17, 2012. Four divisions will again be used. In preparation for the football plan, schools were surveyed with 84% of survey respondents favoring a 4 division plan and 78 % choosing balanced play over travel.

There was one comment from Doug Jacobson, Barnes County North, concerning the 2013 and 2014 football plan.

Executive Secretary Sylling discussed the NDHSAA strategic plan as proposed. An appointed committee with representation around the state identified 4 goals.

1. Review & Update By-Laws
2. Develop new policies to address demographics
3. Financial stability
4. Policies, programs and practices to address new social trends such as uncivil behavior at events, shortage of qualified coaches, shortage of officials, declining participation

A survey was sent to member schools to gather opinions on the goals set forth. Sylling thanked the 49% of schools who responded to this survey. The survey showed there was no opposition to the four goals established. All schools either agree or strongly agree with all four goals. One that surfaced ahead of the rest was to review & update our Constitution & By-Laws. Board of Directors will act on the adoption of the proposed strategic plan at the November 2012 Board meeting.

Sylling addressed the NDHSAA Coaches Education program as part of a broad goal identified to maintain and support educationally based activities. Coaches Education will aid in assuring there is educational value in our activities. It has been determined sport in itself has no educational value. Coaches need to teach while students participate in sports. Handouts were distributed with coaches requirements on one side and submission form on the other to assist schools in record keeping. Schools need to supply a list of coaches that are certified or non certified. If coaches show up on a list the first time, they will have one year to certify. The second year there will be a consequence of a \$200 fine. If coaches are hired after the form due date of April 1st, schools are asked to submit those names to be added to the NDHSAA database. Sylling opened the floor for comments on coaches education. No comments were shared.

Nominating Committees for the upcoming vacancies on the Board of Directors were asked for a report:

1. Rob Lech, Beulah, reported the nominations for the Class B Southwest position on the NDHSAA Board of Directors:
 - a. Riley Mattson, South Heart
 - b. Brad Rinas, Washburn

There were no other nominations from the floor. Motion by Rob Lech, Beulah, to approve nominations. Second by Curt Pierce, Center-Stanton. Motion carried.

2. Brodie Odegaard, Tioga, reported the nominations for the North Dakota Association of Secondary School Principals position on the NDHSAA Board of Directors:
 - a. Todd Bertsch, Fargo South

b. Jason Schwabe, Thompson

There were no other nominations from the floor. Motion by Brodie Odegaard, Tioga, to approve the nominations. Second by Robert Bubach, Strasburg. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary gave his report:

- The association is off to a good start this year. Sylling thanked the board of directors and our member schools for what they do to promote and support activities in their schools. This would be an impossible task without their support. We have an excellent staff in place.
- Constitution & By-Laws committee has begun to work on reformatting the bylaws as per the strategic plan. There will be effort made to get the language so it fits today. Constitution & By-Laws from five NFHS member state associations who recently reformatted their by-laws were reviewed. Member schools are assured any changes to the approved Constitution & By-Laws would come to a vote of member schools.
- One of the first things the committee is looking at is the less than 50 rule. The 50 rule basically applies to junior high students being allowed to move up and down between jr. high and high school if school enrollment is below 50. There are some language issues with that. We are asking district chairs and principals to discuss this. If we are going to stay the way we are, smaller schools may have to utilize 6th graders. If so, then we need to have a process to regulate this. NDHSAA is a 7-12 organization and our catastrophic insurance is for students in grades 7-12. There is a possibility we will continue to cover students in grades 7-12 but if 6th graders play, your school insurance would kick in. Physicals for 6th graders have never been mandated by NDHSAA. This may be an issue for schools using 6th graders. Another issue is the eligibility rules of 6th graders. At this time, 7th and 8th graders moving up and down must be passing all of their subjects. How much addressing of 6th grade issues can we do and stay a 7-12. We would like to find a way to de-regulate 7th and 8th graders but still maintain regulation of 6th graders. If 6th graders are allowed to play, parent pressure will be applied to administrators to play 6th graders.
- Another issue would be our academic eligibility rule. Student needs to be passing 20 hours per week. That is assuming they sit in a classroom for an hour in four classes. As it is, a student may be eligible all four years and not have enough credits to graduate. The NDASSP board met and two principals agree to meet with the Constitution & By-Laws committee to discuss rules of eligibility. Classes have changed with courses on line, virtual schools and the allowance of virtual credits for graduation. If a school allows a class for graduation, why would the NDHSAA not allow the class for participation eligibility. Schools will be surveyed to see what direction academic eligibility should take. Opinions on academic eligibility should be directed to the Board of Directors, Mark Andresen, Mandan and Russ Ziegler, Richardton-Taylor who have agreed to work with the Constitution & By-Laws committee as representatives of NDASSP.
- Sylling shared his concern for football in our state. In order to protect the upper tiers of football, we are hurting 9-man. The next 2 year plan is done, but it won't be very long until we start working on the next 2 year plan. Concussion issues are keeping kids out of football throughout the nation. We need to work now on how are we going to maintain football in our state in the future.
- Spirit of Sport is a National Federation award program to recognize students for exemplary actions. Students throughout the nation have been nominated for this award. Information will be sent to member schools. If you have something worthy of recognition, please submit your application to the NDHSAA office. Each state is entitled to one nominee who will forward to Section 5 for a selection of the Section 5 nominee to forward to the National Federation.
- Nominations for the Distinguished Student program are encouraged. Last year we received our lowest number of applicants. Schools are encouraged to submit applicants for this program and to honor their schools Distinguished Student locally regardless if they are a finalist for the program.
- A calendar change of one week earlier was approved for 2013 boys' soccer due to a conflict with NDCEL Conference and possibly NDEA.

The change is:

- a. Start of season-----August 5, 2013
- b. First Contest-----August 16, 2013

- c. Deadline for regular season---October 5, 2013
- d. State Tournament-----October 10, 11, 12, 2013
- Thoughts were shared from Inside Out Coaching, a book by Joe Ehrmann, former NFL defensive lineman for the Colts.
 - How often do kids get to play creatively, joyously?
 - Play fuels the social, emotional and physical development of young people. With the loss of play comes an increase of stress and isolation. Playing in organized sports is near to impossible. In competition, creative play is moved to a performance platform.
 - We need to find a way to keep kids engaged.
- In closing, Sylling shared some cowboy logic for the thought for the day. “People who are tough never have to tell you they are. Same with people that are honest.”

With no further business, President Ulland declared the meeting adjourned.

 - i. District 14 believes the 6 team regional option costs the association and all member schools all regions money. This will take money out of the overall pocket of the association and affect the finances of the association and team payments.
 - ii. District 1 is concerned districts would lose district concessions.
 - iii. District 6 is concerned when the time comes a super-regional would be mandated by the Board. They would like to have another choice. Regions 1 and 6 like their current system.
 - iv. Region 3 is concerned about being dictated by the board. The region tournaments belong to the association. They do not see the super regional as the best answer. Their request is for something different to compare to the super region idea. A comparison would allow the Board to make a better decision.
 - v. District 15 raised the question if this is something that could be done only in volleyball and not in basketball. Their region is supportive of a change in Volleyball but not in basketball.

2. Requested a discussion on a 2-week dead period the last week in June and first week in July. Rationale is to give everybody some time off. Right now, coaches feel like they have to be doing something and would like to have a 2 week dead period. Vote failed: (2-14)
 - a. Discussion included:
 - i. A concern for who would enforce the dead period. Should be a local control issue.
 - ii. District 15 felt if there was a dead period they would like it closer to the end of July. The end of June, beginning of July is prime camp time.
 - iii. Rationale behind end of June beginning of July would be to go around July 4th for a break for all.
 - iv. District 5 felt if you are having issues at home, take care of it at home. It should be local control issue.
3. AD passes from NDHSAA for all regular season contests. Discussion included that this is already being done by the NDHSCA. Members just need to be made aware. Vote failed: (1-15)

District 7-----Karla Michaelson, AD Carrington HS

1. Requested a move of region track to Friday with a make-up date on Saturday. Current system sets the date for region track on Saturday with the option of moving to Friday if weather deems necessary. Move must be done by Wednesday preceding the region meet and be based on weather predictions with the approval of NDHSAA. Rationale: It is tough to move a track meet from Saturday to Friday on the Wednesday preceding as it is now. Vote failed: (8-8)
 - a. Discussion:
 - i. Participants have plenty of opportunity to qualify during the regular season.
 - ii. Bulk of workers come out of schools.
 - iii. Administrators are concerned with loss of school time.
2. Reduce the number of basketball officials from three to two for post-season tournaments. Rationale: Comments officials have made such as "Wasn't my area so I'm not going to make that call." Vote failed: (2-14)
 - a. Discussion:
 - i. Going from 2 to 3 officials has improved the game.
 - ii. Cop out from officials if they say is not my area. Feels we are going backwards if we go from 3 to 2. Three officials helps bring officials into the realm of officiating.
 - iii. Using 3 officials makes it easier to bring in new officials. Overall officiating has improved since it first started. Officials needed time to adjust to 3 person crews.
 - iv. Coaches need more education on who to chew out. If the official comments it wasn't his call, it probably wasn't. The officials are instructed what to watch in each position using a 3 person crew.
3. Concerns on Minot hosting state volleyball tournament. Discussion centered around a perceived problem with Minot hotels and restaurants. No actual complaints of anything real. Discussion only, no vote requested.

District 8-----Randy Loing, Prin. AD Rolla HS

1. Concern about BEK Sports coming into our facilities and completely taking over. There have been instances where at a volleyball match, the JV match was tied at 1-1 and they weren't allowed to finish the match because BEK Sports needed to get on the air by a certain time. Is this an issue for any other schools? Discussion included the school allows BEK to come in and BEK should not be calling the shots. Local districts have control of their regular season games. Discussion only, no vote requested.
2. Recommendation the volleyball center-line violation needs to be more in-line with college rules. In college you can go across the line as long as you don't impede another player. An informal poll of coaches indicated they would like it to stay the same as it is now. Discussion only, no vote requested.
3. Districts 7 & 8 are looking at putting a proposal together for a Super Regional in volleyball. Discussion only, no vote requested.

District 9-----Brian Nieuwsma, AD Flasher HS

1. In agreement they liked the switch to the colored volleyballs. Discussion only, no vote requested.
2. Would like to host the Region 5 tournament this upcoming season (2013) at Shiloh Christian HS, District 10 hosted consecutive Region 5 tournaments in 2010 & 2011 at Washburn. Discussion only, no vote requested.
3. At this time, District 9 is not interested in moving to a super regional. Would like to see how it works out in Region 7. They are in favor of modifying the district/regional tournaments a bit. They would like each district to advance 3 teams to the regional tournament instead of the current format with 4 teams advancing. The #1 teams from each district would get a bye in the regional tourney and the others would be seeded accordingly. There would only be two games on each day of the regional tourney, which would also solve the out of school time on the first day. Discussion only, no vote requested.
4. District 9 would like to continue to have 6th grade students still be able to participate in junior high activities with the rule change for the Rule of 50. This would be a huge concern for our small schools to continue junior high programs. Discussion only, no vote requested as this will be discussed later in the meeting.

District 10-----Brandt Dick, Supt. HMB and Underwood HS

1. Would like to keep district tournaments and propose to send top 2 teams from districts to regionals for volleyball and basketball. Wanted a straw poll - Would other districts chairs be in favor of allowing a district to have a 4 team region? (5-11 - Opposed- straw poll)
2. Want to have the capability of having 6th graders to compete at the junior high level, if needed, and 6th graders will be covered by the school districts catastrophic insurance. No matter what happens to the 50 Rule, they want this kept no matter how many students are in the school. Vote requested. Vote failed: (8-8)

District 11-----Bob Beaudrie, Prin/AD Newburg HS

No Agenda Items

District 12-----Robert Thom, Prin/AD Kenmare HS

1. Golf in the fall – discussion -

District 13-----Tyler Senn, AD Bowman County HS

1. Suggested two regions of Class B Wrestling. Either East and West or North and South with 16 individuals qualifying to the state tournament, 8 from each region. The top four teams from each region would qualify to the state dual tournament. Rationale: It provides a better representation of our top athletes at the state tournament. The region meets have become very small. Vote failed: (3-13)
 - a. Discussion:
 - i. District 1 voiced concerns in district. They would like North and South regions, not East and West.
 - ii. There were concerns about travel for duals.
 - iii. Whether this would be a one day event or two day tournament? A 2 day event would have to go to a larger facility.
2. District 13 supports a by law change to the JH regulations Discussion only, no vote requested.

District 14-----Mitch Lunde, AD Beulah HS

No agenda items

1. Discussion:
 - a. Appreciate the HS Activities Association working to keep the kids back from the basket at state basketball tournaments. Sportsmanship should be a focus of the HS Activities Association. Any derogatory signs should be removed along with the people that brought them.
 - b. Would like everyone to think about seeding of state tournaments. Go back to districts and ask about opinions on seeding for Volleyball, Girls' Basketball and Boys' Basketball.

District 15-----Randy Cranston, AD Watford City HS

1. Cross Country athletes should have to qualify for state with the top 3 teams and top 40 runners. Request to study, no vote requested.
2. One team should be moved back to District 15 in boys' basketball and girls' basketball to even out teams to 7 and 7. No vote needed as this is a board re-districting issue

1. District 16: Overall participation is down. There is an increase in students coming into districts but participation is not increasing. Would be in favor of eliminating 50 Rule but keeping 6th graders eligible to move to junior high.

Sylling noted that any changes to By-Laws regarding the 50 Rule or 6th graders playing on junior high teams would be presented to the membership as amendments. The Board may make changes to interpretations/regulations but not to the By-Laws.

Olson thanked the committee for their communications conveying items of interest from their districts and informed the group there are no items in which the vote indicated they are to be forwarded to the NDHSAA Board for consideration.

District Chairs Matt Herman, District 5 and Monty Mayer, District 6 appeared to request the Board consider an experiment of a new District/Region format for volleyball, girls' basketball and boys' basketball in Region 3. Region 3 would like a 2-year experiment using the proposed district/region format for volleyball and basketball. They would like to have a 6 team regional tournament. On Monday, the champions from each district would have byes and there would be two games, the 2 and 3 seeds from each district. The remainder of the tournament would be played out the same as currently being done. They believe this experiment would make the district tournament more valuable as the stakes would be higher at the district tournament. Board members are concerned by allowing this plan because of the potential of having 24 different proposals for volleyball and basketball. Board recommendation was to refer this to the tournament committee to recommend criteria for district and region tournaments and review revenue for district and region tournaments.

Motion by Helvik to table and send to the NDHSAA tournament committee with response to board by January, 2013 board meeting. Second by Martin. Roll call vote was taken. Auch – yes, Brannan – yes, Hall – yes, Ham – yes, Helvik – yes, Martin – yes, Roaldson – yes, Sanstead – yes, Wiberg – yes, Ulland – yes. (Olson absent) Motion carried unanimously.

North Dakota Army National Guard representatives Steve Schweitzer, marketing professional and Major Blazek appeared before the board with a request to allow use of military feel jerseys to incorporate community involvement, military presence & appreciation to boys' and girls' teams across the state for players use during a home game. The ND Army National Guard would provide the use of military feel uniforms at an appreciation event in all regions of Girls & Boys Class A and Class B basketball. They would like to show support of the ND Army National Guard and all military members through this activity along with this being a recruiting tool for the ND National Guard. North Dakota National Guard is a supporting partner. Board approval is necessary due to the deviation from NFHS uniform rules. All uniforms would be approved by NDHSAA staff before proceeding.

Motion by Auch to approve the use of military jerseys as presented. Second by Martin. Roll call vote was taken. Wiberg – yes, Brannan – yes, Hall – yes, Auch – yes, Ham – yes, Roaldson – yes Helvik – yes, Martin – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ulland – yes. (Olson absent) Motion carried unanimously.

Consolidated Cable Television, located in Dickinson, ND, requested the Board reconsider tape delay rates for televising tournament games.

Motin by Helvik to deny reduced rates as suggested by Consolidated Cable Television and to follow up with a letter explaining protocol. Second by Ham. Discussion included the need to continue to protect broadcast rights to region and state tournaments. Motion carried unanimously.

NDOA recommendations, tabled at the September Board meeting were discussed. Staff member Fetsch provided a projection of what additional costs would be considering additional officials for basketball and wrestling. Rationale on Basketball and Wrestling were explained. Additional officials for basketball would allow officials to work one game per day. Additional officials for Wrestling would allow for breaks for the current officials. Officials currently work non-stop for 4-5 hours without a break. Waiving first year registration fees for new officials was discussed. Another possibility would be to rebate first year registration fees on the second year a new official registers.

The following recommendations were tabled from the September Board meeting to see if there was any member school input provided:

3. Contract four additional state wrestling tournament officials to serve as assistant referees. Motion by Helvik to approve. Second by Auch. Discussion included a clarification on game fee and per diem. Roll call vote: Wiberg – yes, Brannan – yes, Hall – yes, Auch – yes, Ham – yes, Roaldson – yes Helvik – yes, Martin – yes, Sanstead – yes, Ulland – yes. Motion carried unanimously.
4. Approve a 4% fee increase for 2013-14 and lock that in through 2014-15. Motion by Wiberg to approve. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously
5. Add JV hockey rate of \$50.00 for games with 17 minute periods to the officials fee schedule. There are some schools that have 15 minute periods and some have 17 minutes. This would be consistent to be in effect 2013/14. Motion by Wiberg to approve. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously

Media committee chair Larry Helvik, reported on committee review of the existing television contract and a progress report regarding the development of bid specifications for a new television contract. Media consultant, Stu Swartz from Minnesota was contacted by Sylling. Swartz had been out of the country and got back to Sylling last week. His charge is an upfront fee, a percentage of contracts and travel expenses as approved. Swartz is part of a company that hosts all Minnesota High School League broadcasts (www.grandstadium.tv). The committee recommendation is to continue to pursue Swartz as a consultant. Committee recommends a special board meeting in December or early January to have Swartz explain what services he could provide to the association. Swartz noted our current contract is good and we don't want to compete with the exclusivity provided in our contract. Another option would be to have the media committee meet with Swartz but it was felt the full board audience would be preferred. Recommended leave bids as they are but include a percentage of DVD sales be paid to NDHSAA and add webcast of events not covered by current contract are property of NDHSAA. It is important to maintain the exclusivity of the current contract.

The television contract time line is as follows: Specifications will be finalized by January 26, 2013, with Request for Proposal to be sent February 1, 2013. Bids will be due March 12, 2013, opened March 15, 2013 and awarded March 22, 2013. Specifications discussed by the committee were presented. Items discussed, but not limited to included length of bid, live televised coverage and webcasting. Committee will be meeting prior to the November Board meeting. Additional thoughts should be forwarded to committee members before the November meeting. The Board requested the Executive Secretary to contact Stu Swartz to set up a special media committee meeting. All board members are encouraged to attend the meeting.

Motion by Sanstead to approve media committee report. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Constitution & By-Laws Committee chair Steve Hall, provided a committee report to the Board concerning reformatting of By-Laws and continued discussion on the less than 50 Rule. Discussion was held on the elimination of the less than 50 Rule for schools having an enrollment of less than 50 and junior high participation at the high school level. The district chair vote of 8-8 on keeping the 50 Rule was discussed. ADs seemed in favor of eliminating the less than 50 Rule at the NDIAAA meeting earlier this fall. Class A Review will discuss the less than 50 Rule in December. Grade eligibility for 6th graders was also discussed. The committee made no recommendation on the less than 50 Rule until more feedback is received from Class A Review. In order to allow input from Class A Review if an amendment is proposed, it will not be until the October 2013 membership meeting. The committee is also working on the academic eligibility contained in the NDHSAA By-Laws.

Motion by Helvik to approve Constitution & By-law committee report. Second by Sanstead. Motion carried unanimously.

The Executive Board met and President Ulland informed the Board of penalties assessed against a member school. As a result of the special board meeting on October 31, 2012, it was brought to light that West Fargo used an ineligible student in the West Region Student Congress regular season meet. A letter of reprimand will be sent and include that additional offenses in the future would bring about stiffer penalties. The Board will direct the West Fargo Athletic Director to review eligibility with non-athletic coaches/activity advisors.

Todd Olson, District Chairs meeting chair, provided a brief overview of the District Chairs Meeting. No items received a majority vote and no items will be forwarded to the board for approval. Discussion included the 50 Rule, districts and regions and moving regional track from Saturday to Friday.

Motion by Hall to approve District Chairs committee report. Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

In representative reports Auch reported he has been elected to the position of South West Director of the North Dakota Association of School Boards. Brannan was asked by the North West schools to bring to the board an issue some 9 man schools had in his region. Some districts have 10 schools, which means some schools will be required to play a Tuesday and Friday the first week of the season. All other regions have 9 teams. Any team that schedules 9 games has that problem. Creative scheduling may resolve that problem.

North East representative Ham reported some people were questioning the cost of tickets for volleyball.

South West representative Helvik voiced a suggestion in his district to have the state volleyball tournament in the Minot Auditorium instead of the Dome.

The next meeting will be held on Saturday, January 26, 2013 at the Ramkota Hotel in Bismarck. Athletic Review in the morning and Board meeting at 1:00 pm. General Membership meeting will be held on Monday, January 28, 2013 at the Ramkota Hotel in Bismarck.

President Ulland informed the Board of penalties assessed by the Executive Board against a member school for a violation. Fargo North used an ineligible boys' basketball player this season. The family did not move lock stock and barrel. The school had played 5 games of which one was won and four were lost. As penalty, five games were forfeited. The student must sit out another 5 games after the family moves to Fargo and verified by Fargo North administration. This information was relayed to Fargo Public Schools and the situation has been remedied.

The Region 3 request for an experimental region tournament proposal tabled and directed to the Board Tournament Committee from the November meeting was discussed. Steve Hall, Tournament Committee Chair indicated the committee discussed the request and the committee recommendation was to deny Region 3's request for a 6-team region tournament. The Tournament Committee felt an 8-team single elimination tournament should be standard. Each district could determine which 8-teams would be representatives for region tournaments. Also discussed was the overall future of district tournaments. We may not have the same as we do now in the future. The committee's recommendation would be to deny the request from Region 3 and recommend the creation of region guidelines.

- Motion by Olson to deny the Region 3 request for an experimental region tournament. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.
- Motion by Hall to create guidelines for all region tournament proposals to an 8 team, bracketed, single elimination tournament format. Second by Olson.
- Motion amended by Wiberg to create guidelines for all region tournament proposals to a bracketed, single elimination tournament with a minimum 8 team format for Class B basketball and volleyball. Second by Brannan. Amendment to the motion carried unanimously. Roll call vote was taken on amended motion. Roaldson – yes, Martin – yes, Baesler – yes, Ham – yes, Hall – yes, Brannan – yes, Olson – yes, Wiberg – yes, Auch – yes, Helvik – yes, Ulland – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Larry Helvik, Media Committee Chair, provided an update of committee work to the Board. November 29th the media committee had a conference call to discuss the possibility of hiring Stu Schwartz as a

media consultant for NDHSAA. Schwartz requested a minimum fee of \$6,000 per year for 3 years. The committee recommended not to hire Schwartz as a media consultant. Chuck Schmidt, a staff member from the Arizona Interscholastic Association has been invited to North Dakota to share what Arizona is doing with webcasting. Chuck will be in Valley City on February 20, 2013 to address the Media Committee and available Board members. He will discuss what Arizona's program and advise NDHSAA future television and webcasting options. A meeting time was set for 10:00 am on February 20, 2013.

Sylling discussed television bid specifications for Board consideration. The specifications maintain exclusivity on all televised games. Games not televised would be under the control of NDHSAA. Webcasting is not included in the proposed contract.

Class A Review Committee members: West, Jim Roaldson, Jamestown and Jeff Dornfeld, Williston, East, Randy Nelson, Shanley and Todd Olson, Fargo, NDHSAA Board Representative, Scott Ulland, May-Port CG and Executive Secretary Sylling met on January 16, 2013 via conference call.

The following recommendations were made.

1. Discussion regarding moving state gymnastics to the first weekend in March beginning in 2013-14.
Table until spring and give the gymnastics community an opportunity to respond.
2. Discussion regarding elimination of the less than 50 rule.
Support a rule change which would allow junior high students to move up and down competition levels regardless of school size. The committee felt the less than 50 rule should still apply to the use of sixth graders.

Steve Hall, Committee Chair, provided a Constitution & By-Laws Committee report regarding amending the less than 50 rule for junior high students competing on high school teams. At a previous board meeting the staff was directed to come back to the Board with a change in wording of the areas of the Constitution & By-Laws that refer to the 50 rule. After discussing the issue with Class A Review and NDIAAAA, the following suggestions were made. Approval for changes below will be requested in March with the interpretation changes to be in effect beginning in 2013-2014.

PART TWO - ARTICLE XIV- RULES OF ELIGIBILITY - INTERPRETATIONS - SECTION II (Page 23 of Part II-Q: 2 & 4)

2. Q: May a student play on the high school team if he/she is in the seventh or eighth grade?
A: This is possible under this rule but the assumption is that the practice of playing seventh or eighth graders will be limited to the small school where available participant numbers may be limited. In schools maintaining grades 7-8-9 as a unit, competition in those grades between other Junior Highs within the city and nearby area is recommended, rather than encouraging children at the Junior High School level to seek membership on the regular high school team. ~~In the event 7th and 8th grade students are placed on a ninth grade team that has been declared a high school team, they will remain eligible for junior high competition. Should a 7th or 8th grader be placed on a team consisting of tenth graders or higher, they will no longer be eligible for junior high competition. However, such students are eligible for participation on the high school team, but if once elevated to a high school team are no longer eligible for the junior high team in that sport during that sport season. NOTE: The exception to this rule is in the sports of track, cross-country, golf and wrestling for all schools as well as in all sports for schools with a combined enrollment of less than 50 in the 7th and 8th grade. (Board approved June 2004)~~
~~The total enrollment count must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule is applied.~~

If a junior high student is elevated and participates in high school competition they shall be able to move back to junior high competition.

Care should be exercised that dual participation on two school teams does not result in "over" participation. Individual and team limits as spelled out in sport/activity regulations shall be administered. School administrators and coaches who permit this dual participation membership must assume the responsibility of preventing over-participation.

4. Q: Are there any conditions under which a fifth or sixth grader may be a member of a high school team?

A: No, not under the present rules and regulations. However, it is possible for him/her to be a member of a junior high team if the enrollment in grades 7 and 8 is less than 50 is not over fifty (50) with the exception of football and wrestling.

The total enrollment count must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule is applied.

PART FIVE - JUNIOR HIGH AND SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADE BY-LAWS – ARTICLE III: GENERAL REGULATIONS - OTHER REGULATIONS (Page 3 of Part V-Other Regulations: Guidelines for Jr High Competition)

General Statement:

In the junior high school if the 9th graders are kept separate for competition and teams are composed strictly of 9th graders, the regulations for each sport are exactly the same as they are for high school teams. Whenever a team is composed of students from grades 7-8-9, 8-9, 7-8, or 7-9 these teams are limited to regulations pertaining to junior high school teams.

GUIDELINES FOR JUNIOR HIGH COMPETITION

~~1. Member schools with teams in both junior and senior high school may select pupils in grades 7, 8 or 9 for either junior high teams or as members of high school teams.~~

~~1.2. Seventh and eighth grade students who participate on a ninth grade team declared for high school status may still be eligible for 7th or 8th grade competition.~~ If a junior high student is elevated and participates in high school competition they shall be able to move back to junior high competition.

~~2.3. A team made up of a combination of 7th and 8th grade students is considered a junior high team and is subject to those limitations as outlined in the By-Laws. Seventh and eighth grade students elevated to teams consisting of any grades 10 through 12 are no longer eligible for junior high competition.~~ Seventh and eighth grade students may be "moved up" to a high school team.

~~3.4. A ninth grade team may be declared for junior high status or high school status and that team must maintain that status the entire season. Ninth grade teams choosing high school status must be comprised of at least 50% ninth grade students.~~

~~5. A combination junior high team (8 and 9 or 7, 8 and 9) may compete against a ninth grade team if such combination team has been designated as a high school team. Reference Section XIII~~

~~6. Ninth grade teams that have declared high school status MUST follow high school limitations. They must be designated as a high school team when the season begins so it is clear they cannot compete against teams with junior high status.~~

~~4.7. If a combination team (8 and 9 or 7, 8 and 9) has less than 50% ninth grade students, that team cannot declare high school status and must follow junior high limitations.~~

~~5.8. All Jr. High seasons shall be no longer than the high school season in that sport. No Jr. High participant may participate in a total number of consecutive weeks in excess of the number of weeks established for the high school season.~~

~~9. The total enrollment count applicable to 50 or less enrollment regulations must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule applies.~~

A By-Law reformat was proposed as per our Strategic Plan. A draft was given to the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. A draft will be sent to all board members.

Legal opinion from Gary Thune was shared on participation of home school students.

Baesler shared a letter from an attorney in the Washington DC area indicating his opinion home school students have every right to open enroll in any district of their choice. The opinion was supported by the North Dakota Attorney General's ND DPI representative. Open enrollment may or may not be accepted by the open enroll school.

Motion by Helvik to approve Constitution & By-Laws Committee report. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Hall, Committee Chair of Combined Tournament Committee, reported the committee met December 5th in Carrington to discuss the following recommendations:

1. Recommend approval of request by the Ralph Engelstad Arena to move state hockey to Grand Forks in 2013-14 and Fargo in 2014-15 due to a scheduling conflict at the Ralph Engelstad Arena.
Motion by Hall to approve change. Second by Olson. Motion carried unanimously.
2. Recommend changing the state site for girls' tennis from Minot to Grand Forks in 2012-13 and from Grand Forks to Minot in 2013-14 due to court conditions in Minot.
Motion by Hall to approve change. Second by Helvik. Motion carried unanimously.
3. * Recommend approval of Class B golf sites and other state tournament sites through 2019-20.
4. Recommend the Board to review/reconsider Minot as the host of the State A Basketball Tournament in 2013-14. Pat McNally, AD Minot Public Schools, Rick Hedberg, Minot State University and Wendy Howe Minot CVB were present to speak on behalf of the site and answer questions. Tournament will be held at Minot State University and Minot Auditorium. Shuttle busses between the venues will be provided. Motel rooms have been reserved. Nine new hotels have been opened within the last year and occupancy rates are down in Minot. Wendy Howe, Minot CVB stated the average rate of hotel rooms in Minot in December was \$117 with 51% occupancy.

Kirk Ham, Finance Committee Chair, provided the Board with recommendations for 2013-14 staff salaries to include a 4% raise for professional staff, a \$.70/hour increase for Sue Carlsrud & Patty Bass and an \$.80/hour increase for Sharon Prosby for a total cost of approximately \$23,000. Also discussed was the current pension plan. Staff is exploring options for retirement programs and will bring any future recommendations to the Board. Motion by Martin with second from Helvik to approve the Finance Committee report. Motion carried unanimously.

Proposed legislation was discussed. Specifically discussed was legislation concerning a change in the concussion legislation and the start of the school year. The agenda for the General Assembly, which will meet on Monday, January 28, 2013, was also discussed. Mandi Egeland, NDHSAA/Farmers Union Insurance Distinguished Student will not be able to be in attendance due to an illness. Kirsten Baesler will provide a report of the Canvassing Committee. There will be a special presentation for Dr. Wayne Sanstead for his retirement from the NDHSAA Board of Directors. Sylling will discuss Coaches Education and play NFHS/NDIAAA/NDHSAA Public Service Announcements from NFHS and NDIAAA.

A letter from Century High School principal, Lee Ziegler voiced concern about loss of school time for the state volleyball tournament due to the scheduled practice (Hit-Around) times. Recommend the issue be forwarded to the tournament committee for consideration.

In representative reports:

Helvik questioned if there was an upcoming change of uniforms. He also questioned using a point system to assign seeding for tournaments.

Baesler reported SB 2263, a Bullying Bill, adds definition of bullying to include students and fans that substantially interrupt school or school sponsored events. The bill includes the immediate removal of an offending student or fan immediately, required reporting to law enforcement and a ban for remainder of school year.

SB 2320 includes the reporting of release of student law enforcement records to schools when felony charges are filed.

Ulland: Questioned the status of National Guard uniform promotion previously approved by the Board. Bubach reported the Army National Guard has been delayed and will most likely be pushed back to 2013-14.

Executive Secretary's report included the discussion of a ruling from the Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights which has implications to all member schools. The United States Government Accountability Office (GAO) published a report that underscored access to, and participation in, extracurricular athletic opportunities provide important health and social benefits to all students, particularly those with disabilities. These benefits can include socialization, improved teamwork and leadership skills, and fitness. The GAO found students with disabilities are not being afforded an equal opportunity to participate in extracurricular athletics in public elementary and secondary schools. The DOE document is available on the NDHSAA website. A major concern that stood out was athletics and activities may be viewed as a right and not a privilege.

The next meetings will be held Wednesday, February 20, 2013 in Valley City, on Friday, March 15, 2013 at the Ramkota Hotel in Bismarck and Friday, March 22, 2013 at the Fargo Radisson.

President Ulland declared the meeting adjourned.

The Distinguished Student receives a \$2,000 scholarship, the runner-up a \$1,000 scholarship and the other four finalists receive \$500 scholarships for this program. If member schools would like NDHSAA to assist your school when recognizing these students locally, contact the NDHSAA office. Applications must be postmarked by April 1st.
4. Beginning the fall of 2013 all coaches who work with student-athletes in grades 9-12 must be certified. This is a worthwhile effort to educate coaches throughout ND. Verification of coach certification for schools will be sent to NDHSAA prior to April 1st each year. On this form all coaches and assistant coaches in grades 9-12 will be listed and whether they are certified. The first time a coach shows up on a form as non-certified they will receive a warning. For

each additional coach there will be a fine assessed. There have been questions regarding what courses qualify for the fundamentals of coaching requirement for certification. The NFHS has a Fundamentals of Coaching course that is not required but recommended. The fundamentals of coaching should not be a sport specific course. It should not be about the Xs and Os of coaching. The course should deal with the philosophy of coaching. Sport specific courses would count toward the renewal requirement. We will again send out the information regarding coaches education. This information will also be on the NDHSAA website.

5. January 2012, Region 7 was granted permission for a 2-year experiment with the format of region Basketball and Volleyball tournament. The experiment is for the 2013/14 and 2014/15 school years. The board felt it was important to develop guidelines for other regions who may choose to request an experiment. The region requirement for Class B volleyball and basketball tournaments is as follows: The region tournament shall be a bracketed tournament with a minimum of 8 teams. How regions get to those 8 teams would be spelled out in a proposal to NDHSAA. There will be no approval for plans having less than 8 teams in their region tournaments brackets.
6. Constitution & By-Laws committee has been busy. The "Less than 50" rule recommendation allows 7th and 8th grade students that are elevated and participate in high school competition the ability to move back to junior high competition. The recommendation continues to allow 5th & 6th grade students to play for junior high teams if their enrollment in junior high is not over 50 in all sports except wrestling and football. This allows local control of junior high athletics, but allows smaller schools to use 5th & 6th graders to maintain their junior high programs. The Board heard the recommendation and will vote on adoption in March.
7. TV bid specifications were approved by the Board of Directors. NDHSAA is exploring webcasting of non-televised region and state games as a new source of revenue. A consultant will meet with the media committee and the Board of Directors in February to explore options.
8. Legislative updates include: House Bill 1028, a concussion bill with more clarification passed the House Committee. House Bill 1248, a school calendar bill did not make it out of committee. If this bill were to come back, it would have huge implications to the NDHSAA calendar.
9. There was discussion of a ruling from the Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights which has implications to all member schools. The United States Government Accountability Office (GAO) published a report that underscored that access to, and participation in, extracurricular athletic opportunities provide important health and social benefits to all students, particularly those with disabilities. These benefits can include socialization, improved teamwork and leadership skills, and fitness. The GAO found students with disabilities are not being afforded an equal opportunity to participate in extracurricular athletics in public elementary and secondary schools. The DOE document is available on the NDHSAA website. A major concern was athletics and activities may be viewed as a right and not a privilege.
10. Thank you to the staff and board for their commitment as well as the membership for supporting student activities. Reminded member schools "We work for you".
11. In closing, Sylling shared a quote from a 2012 Distinguished Student application. "You don't need to be the best to make a difference." We live in a culture that tells us we have to be the best. This quote tells us we can all make a difference.

President Ulland thanked the membership for their attendance and attention and declared the meeting adjourned.

The Class B District Chair meeting was held on March 22, 2013 at the Downtown Radisson, Fargo. Chairman Ulland called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with all districts represented.

The Executive Secretary thanked the member schools for past service. Sheets were passed around to allow each member to complete information on the 2014 Basketball District chairperson and each district's recommendation for district and region sites, dates and managers.

Chairman Ulland welcomed the district chairpersons and thanked them for representing their district. Each representative introduced themselves as district items were presented. Each district was given the opportunity to present their district's recommendations, which are listed as submitted.

District 15----Randy Cranston, AD Watford City

1. Voiced a concern about MVP. Schools are not updating MVP. Their district made a point to update their rosters. If it is going to be what we want it to be then we should update as the season progresses. Schools update only if they are going to state. One request is to move the date back 2, 3 or 4 weeks. Sylling indicated with technology it is easy to change pictures and update rosters at any time.
2. Change Boys' and Girls' Basketball Seasons. Would like to see to the girls' season first and the boys' season last. The rationale for changing is they don't feel girls' region tournament is as well attended. Changing the season would help with attendance. Also, boys' state tournament must be in Grand Forks, Minot or Fargo. They would like the tournament to be

held in Bismarck and the current season placement does not allow that. Original thought was this would help girls' basketball participation. Many districts did not see a reason to change when it was changed. **Vote Requested: Yes: 12-4**

3. Shorten volleyball season. The volleyball season is too long. If the season is shortened the State Volleyball Tournament would be on the same weekend as State Football. This would also affect invitational tournament schedules. No vote requested
4. State Wrestling and District Basketball same weekend. Dual sport athletes are affected. Calendar shows this would be only for one more year. No vote requested.
5. District realignment needs to be addressed. Currently there are eight (8) teams in one district and six (6) in another. An alternative would be super region tournament. Sylling stated District realignment will be addressed. Something needs to be done and it may be something drastic. The realignment committee has been requested to address the makeup of districts. No vote requested.
6. If a facility has only one (1) shot clock working, it should still be used. Several districts had problems during the season or post season with shot clocks not working so they were not used. **Vote Requested: Yes (16-0)**
7. Discuss a Mercy Rule. If there is a 35 point differential in the second half, keep a running clock. The current rule puts schools, coaches and administrators in a very uncomfortable position. The shot clock complicates the issue because the players are forced to take a shot within the shot clock parameters. Do we want a mercy rule or not? Leave the details to board and advisory.
8. For discussion only: Would like NDHSAA to take over region baseball. Some regions thought dates should be left to local control but how brackets are created should be NDHSAA decision. Consensus: Format – Yes, Dates – No

District 16----Michael Bergstrom, Asst. AD Ray

1. Switch Boys and Girls starts for basketball with Girls starting first, then two weeks later, boys start – Previously discussed in District 15.
2. Mercy Rule in Basketball. Previously discussed in District 16. **Vote Requested: 13-3**
3. T shirt sales for district and region tournaments - changing the % going to the NDHSAA. Sylling informed the District Chairs the history of the T-shirt percentage. This was a request from districts to allow the sale of T-Shirts at District tournaments so the board made the decision to grant the request and the percentage is the same percentage that NDHSAA shares with groups at region and state tournaments to sell T-shirts

District 14----Mitch Lunde, AD Beulah

1. Request the State B tournament in girls' volleyball, girls' basketball and boys' basketball tournaments are seeded using a process determined by the NDHSAA. Other states have done District Chairs Notes March 22, 2013 / Page 2 this. Always pros and cons but the thoughts are this would make for a better tournament. It would increase the chance of the two best teams meeting in the finals which would make for a better tournament. Coaches would vote but may not vote for their own team. There was concern about politicking from the coaches and discussion on what criteria would be used. **Vote Requested: (10-6)**
2. Make a District Chair appointment a 3-year commitment. Rational is to provide consistency in the process. Discussion included making this suggestion at the district level. By NDHSAA Constitution & By-Law, this is not within the control of the Board. It is a district responsibility to choose their representation within their District. By Constitution & By-Law the District Chair representative must be a Superintendent, Principal or AD.
3. Remove districts without certain activities (ex-wrestling) from the voting process to determine wrestling discussion or reduce number needed to go to the NDHSAA board based on non-activity districts. Although we agree that they should have say in areas that may affect them financially and that may be through contact with their NDHSAA board member. Sylling reminded Chairs that each and every person in the room is eligible to become a NDHSAA Board member at some time. As a Board member you would be responsible to make decisions on all sports and activities, not just the ones your school participates in.
4. Two regions from wrestling on an East/West format and if participant number adjustments by region need to be made then teams could be moved as needed. At the coaches meeting a

vote was taken to go to two regions. The coaches voted 16-15 to go to North and South. Wrestling advisory comes in at the end of April and will decide what will go forth to the board. Region 2 and their coaches voted to keep 4 regions.

District 13-----Brandt Gaugler, Prin/AD Beach

1. Remove the 50 or more/less enrollment rule from Junior High By-Laws. Rationale - due to low participation numbers, we need more flexibility in running our junior high programs. Note this will be voted upon at the 3/22/13 Board meeting.
2. Support a 2-region state wrestling plan in Class B wrestling with East and West regions. Rationale included fewer wrestling numbers creating non-competitive regional/state tournaments.
 - a. Region 4 wrestling 2013 - 14 weight classes (top 4 wrestlers qualify for state in each weight class)
 - b. 2 weight classes with 4 wrestlers (all qualify for state)
 - i. (6 of 8 wrestlers in these 2 weights with losing records)
 - c. 9 weight classes with 5 wrestlers (36 of 45 qualify for state)
 - i. (9 of 36 wrestlers in these weights to state w/losing records)
 - d. 2 weight classes with 6 wrestlers
 - e. 1 weight class with 7 wrestlers
 - f. Sending 19 of 56 wrestlers (34%) to state with losing records
 - i. - 3-12, 2-14, 5-24, 6-14, 2-16, 4-13, 5-26, 5-12 records.
 - g. Question the competition levels at early rounds of state tournament.
3. Recommend seeding top 4 teams at State B volleyball, girls' basketball, & boys' basketball tournaments. Participating coaches vote. Coaches cannot vote for own team, after top seeds are selected, remaining teams drawn in. Rationale, current tournament format often allows for top seeds facing off in opening rounds diminishing the chance of the two best teams meeting in the state championship game. Previously discussed in District 14.
4. District 13 not in favor of switching girls' basketball & boys' basketball seasons. Previously discussed in Region 15.
5. District 13 is interested in discussing the idea of a Super State B tournament in basketball. Currently have no proposals but wondering if there is interest from other districts. Combining the Class A tournament was a positive move for Class A. It would be a good move for Class B. Worthy of discussion, however logistics are extremely difficult. Girls' and boys' districts would be held at the same time, girls' and boys' regions would be held at the same time, girl' and boy's state would be held at the same time. This would be a possible venue problem.

District 12-----Bryan Kramer, Minot Ryan (sitting in for Robert Thom, Prin/AD Kenmare)

1. Switching boys' and girls' basketball seasons. Previously discussed.
2. Clarification on coaching certification. Coaches are looking for clarification but in looking at the NDHSAA website, all of the information is there. So clarification is not necessary. If a coach is hired late, they would have until April 1st to report. Schools are recommended to have all coaches certified before they work with students. Some districts are already requiring this. Question having former wrestlers come in and work with students over a break. Would they need to be certified? This is under local control. As a rule of thumb, if they are unsupervised with kids they must be certified. District Chairs Notes March 22, 2013 / Page 3
3. Requiring district basketball tournament officials to attend a day camp. Some district crews had not worked three man crews and a day camp would be helpful. This is under local control. NDHSAA does not select district officials. It is currently a requirement for region and state officials.
4. Not on agenda but want discussion on selecting of district officiating crews. Currently district crews are not allowed to work both girls' and boys' district tournament. Sylling reminded districts if they want to require officials to attend a day camp, they have control over that. We need to develop officials to help them grow. If we give the big games to the same guys all the time, we are not going to grow the pool of officials.

District 11-----Bob Beaudrie, Prin/AD Newburg

1. Free Throw Rule - Switching the rule so players can go on release of shot. This would be a NFHS rule change and would have to go through the rule change process. North Dakota

deviates from NFHS Rules preventing us from having a voice on the rule selection/change process.

2. Switching back seasons - preferably girls' basketball in fall; at the least – girls' basketball starting earlier in winter. Previously discussed.
3. Region Tournament in Dome for Region 6 – Minot Auditorium has several District 13 teams that play there during the year. Unfair advantage. No vote requested.
4. Flopping on block/charges - Need to be consistent and make calls. Lots of no calls on flops. No vote requested.
5. Mercy rule? Previously discussed.
6. Discussion only – Bring back in person rules clinics for officials. Staff member Fetsch indicated the purpose of workshops is to explain items to officials in more detail and workshops are required. Recommendation to tell coaches to make use of workshops.

District 10-----Brandt Dick, Supt. Underwood

1. We would like to see the Boys' Class B Tournament be the last tournament, switch with girls' basketball. We would like to know have the numbers in girls' basketball improved for participation with the current switch? Rationale, we would like to see the Boys' Class B Tournament be held in Bismarck. Previously Discussed.
2. If the switch cannot happen, District 10 would like to pick a permanent site for the Class B Boys' and Girls' State basketball tournaments like the NDHSAA does for Track and Hockey. We would like to see Minot be the Class B Boys' State Tournament Site, and Bismarck be the Class B Girls' State Tournament Site. Not much discussion.
3. As we move forward, would like to see a different fee schedule for varsity refs when doing three man crews as compared to two man crews. Feel that some refs are refusing two man crews because it is easier to ref with three man crews, and with pay the same, no incentive to do two man crews. No vote requested.
4. Like to see refs limited to working the same region basketball tournament to two consecutive years. **Vote Requested: (2-13)**
5. Have other parts of the state had struggles with refs breaking contracts? What options do schools have if this happens? Discussion: Yes, some districts had problems. Suggestion was to go back to association you worked with if you have a contract. Recommendation is to have a contract.
6. Large Group Music Festival discussion. How are these dates set? Dates are set by regions. Would like flexibility to adjudicate at a different region if there is a weather conflict. Representation of music regions is delineated in the Constitution & By-Laws. Region administrators set and approve dates. No vote requested.

District 9-----Brian Nieuwsma, AD Flasher

1. Winter Sport Seasons – Previously Discussed.
 - a. Switch boys'/girls' seasons around, look at the numbers for girls' basketball and see if they have gone up since the switch of seasons
 - b. b. If there isn't a switch of seasons we would like to propose permanent sites for girls' and boys' basketball state tournaments, this has been done before with football and track. Proposed sites for boys' basketball would be Minot and girls' basketball in Bismarck.
2. Officials
 - a. What is the rotation for regional officials? We propose that they do no more than two (2) consecutive years in a row. Fetsch indicated there is a sit rule for working state tournaments. Officials may work three (3) years in a row need to sit out one year. Currently no rule for regions. Adding a sit rule for regions would severely impact the choice of officials due to the number of officials needed across the state for boys' and girls' basketball regions.
 - b. What is the selection process for how officials are selected to do regionals, this needs to be put in writing as to how the process works. Fetsch shared information on how coaches voted by region. All coaches are surveyed in addition to workshop supervisors. District Chairs Notes March 22, 2013 / Page 4
 - c. Concerns with officials honoring contracts, anything we can do about this? We would like to pass this concern on to the officials association. Fetsch will pass this on to NDOA at their next meeting.

- d. Mercy Rule - Previously Discussed.
- e. Training, what education is out there for officials with 3 man crews? Fetch indicated both workshops and day camps are available for education on working with a 3 man crew.

District 8-----Randy Loing, Prin/AD Rolla

- 1. Both boys' basketball and girls' basketball coaches would like to see the results (just totals, not individual school votes) of the voting for region tournament referees. - Previously Discussed.
- 2. Wrestling Region is against a 2 Region wrestling plan. Previously Discussed.

District 7-----Karla Michaelson, AD Carrington

- 1. Regional Track meet held on a Friday instead of Saturday (weather) Track meet would be scheduled for Friday with weather day on Saturday. **Vote Requested: (5-11)**
- 2. Subvarsity and junior high basketball tournaments held in 1 day (3 games), hour between games **Vote Requested: (15-1)**

District 6-----Monty Mayer, AD Kidder County

- 1. Super regional for wrestling: split north and south. - Previously Discussed.
- 2. Broadcasting of games: What are other schools doing? BEK is taking over, what are other schools doing? No discussion

District 5-----Derrick Bopp, Prin/AD Kulm

- 1. No agenda items.

District 4-----Lee Beattie, AD North Border-Pembina

- 1. Region baseball dates - playing 3 days followed by school day. **Vote Requested: (14-1)**
- 2. Fall Golf – would like to move boys' and girls' B golf to the fall. How will that affect football participation? Trade off, affects baseball and track now. Feels it should be tried. **Vote Requested: (3-12)**

District 3-----Patti Aanenson, AD Larimore

- 1. How has the Super Regional gone in Region 7? Is there any talk at the State level of mandating this? Discussion: The Region 7 Super Region Tournament does not start until 2013/14 school year.
- 2. Is the coaching box being enforced? Request this be referred to NDOA to see if they are enforcing.
- 3. Where does the responsibility lie for control of the game, such as language and gestures by coaches and players? This should refer back to coaches and administrators, it should not rely completely on officials. Request Fetsch to ask NDOA to see if they see a problem.

Larry Helvik, media committee chair, provided a media committee report. BEK Communications appeared before the media committee to appeal the denial of media passes for state tournaments. Committee recommendation is to deny request from BEK Communications for media passes for state tournaments. BEK Communications does not qualify as a traditional broadcast resource according to NDHSAA policy.

BEK Communications requested NDHSAA adjust the television bid specification "NDHSAA will not allow live televised coverage of any NDHSAA sponsored event that would conflict with any televised event covered in this bid." Recommendation to deny the request. The bid process was completed using the television contract specifications as written.

Television bids were opened on March 15th in Bismarck. Committee recommendation is to accept Forum Communications bid pending negotiations of the additional comments received with the bid. NDHSAA has been pleased with the North Dakota NBC's partnership and thanked them for past service. Both bids met the specifications. The committee further recommended one person from the office and one person from the media committee meet with Forum Communications to negotiate the additional comments contained in the bid. ND NBC and Forum Communications were both represented at the Board meeting.

Motion by Baesler to accept the media committee recommendation to accept the Forum Communications television bid and begin the negotiation process. Second by Ham.

Baesler offered an amendment to her motion to accept Forum Communications television bid adding the clarification of bullets 3, 4, 9, 10 and 11 on the Forum Communications additional comments. Second by Ham.

Discussion included the fact this amendment would limit discussion of the other bullets.

Call for the question on the amendment.

Roll call vote: Ulland – no, Olson – no, Auch – no, Roaldson – no, Martin – no, Ham – no, Brannan – no, Helvik – no, Hall – no, Wiberg – no, Baesler – no. Amendment to the motion defeated unanimously.

Discussion as follows:

Forum Communications and ND NBC were provided opportunities to address the Board and answer any questions concerning bids.

The Board questioned one of the stipulations concerning streaming rights, especially of non-broadcast games. If an event is not televised, the Board would request the ability to keep streaming rights. Streaming rights were not included on the NDHSAA television specifications; however both bidders added streaming rights as additional items in their bids.

Board members questioned the minimum number of games per tournament, which is four (4). In clarification, the NDHSAA bid requested a minimum of four (4) games per tournament be televised.

Board members questioned covering signage in the arena from other media outlets (i.e. television and/or radio stations) during the tournament.

Also questioned was whether it was a normal stipulation to request delaying the broadcast of tournament game highlights until the evening session was concluded for that day.

Committee recommended Sylling be involved with negotiations due to his past history and Wiberg be the media committee representative due to his proximity and the fact he has three years left on the board.

Forum Communications, represented by Bill Marcil, CEO of Forum Communications, stated KVLV has done a wonderful job in the past and Forum Communications will do an equal or better job in the future. The Public Service Announcements in the proposed bid was a minimum amount. Forum Communications can also add print as another media avenue. They would withdraw the digital rights specification if requested. A market not currently pursued by television is the NDHSAA music competition. Marcil added the potential for televising the NDHSAA music competition would be something that could be explored. Television stations in the Forum package include WDAZ in Grand Forks, KBMY in Bismarck, KMCY in Minot, KXMD in Williston and KXMA-2 in Dickinson.

Jim Wareham, Valley News Live general manager represented ND NBC explained their history of 25-30 years of broadcasting NDHSAA events. Over 30 years and 700 games they have never had a service failure. He urged NDHSAA to look at the track record they have had over the past years and know there would be no difference in the future. They would like to continue to provide a great service. ND NBC offered to withdraw the digital rights, if that is an issue. ND NBC would like digital taken out of the bid completely and be allowed to re-bid. When questioned on high definition coverage Wareham assured the Board ND NBC's conversion is and has been ongoing and games next year would be in HD. Also noted was ND NBC's bid offered double the number of Public Service Announcements included in Forum Communications bid. Shawn Kelley, Operations Manager, added additional PSAs would allow us to draw attention to NDHSAA and all the good things that are happening.

Roll call vote on motion to accept the Forum Communications television bid and begin negotiation process. Olson – yes, Auch – yes, Roaldson – yes, Martin – yes, Ham – yes, Brannan - No, Helvik – yes, Hall – yes, Wiberg – yes, Baesler – yes – Ulland - No
Motion carried.

Helvik reported results of the February 20th meeting with Chuck Schmidt from the Arizona Interscholastic Association regarding webcasting and the NDHSAA website. Schmidt offered Brian Bolitho, AIA Director of Business Media and Jason Urasky, AIA programmer, analyze NDHSAA and MVP sites and make recommendations on their findings. Upon analysis of both MVP and NDHSAA websites it was determined both are maintainable from the current code base, but the recommendation would be to start over with a common code base for the NDHSAA to manage and control. This opportunity would allow the NDHSAA to start with a modern framework allowing easier management and user interface. In figuring high, Schmidt estimated we could do what we need to do on our sites for \$30,000.

Also discussed the option of sharing a computer programmer between NDHSAA and AIA allowing both associations to benefit from the use of common code, shared modules and access to a computer programmer.

Arizona would like to hire another programmer but do not have enough work for an additional person. Additional programmer would be between \$50,000 and \$60,000 and they would be interested in a shared computer programmer.

Sylling recommended we continue to pursue this option. He will bring additional information to the April meeting if this is something we would like to pursue.

Motion by Auch to move forward with Arizona to craft a proposal to work with a shared programmer on changes to MVP and NDHSAA sites. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Sylling will meet with the Executive Director from Arizona at the NFHS legal conference in April and bring information back to the NDHSAA Board at their April meeting.

Motion by Ham to approve the media committee report. Second by Brannan. Motion carried unanimously.

Larry Helvik, Realignment Committee Chair provided a recommendation to assign Central McLean to the north region for softball.

The committee also discussed girls' basketball, boys' basketball and volleyball regions. It was noted realignment of regions must be discussed considering all of the cooperative sponsorship changes. NDHSAA will have to explore significant changes to regions to create a long-term solution. Timing is essential and the creation of 2-year plans for basketball and volleyball may be explored.

Baesler indicated cooperative sponsorships lead districts to delay their decisions on consolidation. Cooperative sponsorships allow schools to stay open with a lower enrollment because schools can coop to maintain sports and activities without the student base to maintain programs on their own.

Motion by Auch to approve realignment committee report. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

As per the NDHSAA strategic plan, recommendation for change in the less than 50 rule was made by the Constitution & By-Laws Committee. The language changes allow junior high students in all sized schools the ability to move to high school competition and back to junior high competition. Fifth and sixth grade students will continue to be eligible for junior high competition in non contact sports only in schools with junior high enrollments less than 50. Exact wording of the change appears below. Highlighted areas have been added and words with a strike through will be removed. The change will become effective fall 2013.

PART TWO - ARTICLE XIV- RULES OF ELIGIBILITY - INTERPRETATIONS - SECTION II(Page 23 of Part II-Q: 2 & 4)

2. Q: May a student play on the high school team if he/she is in the seventh or eighth grade?

A: This is possible under this rule but the assumption is that the practice of playing seventh or eight graders will be limited to the small school where available participant numbers may be limited. In schools maintaining grades 7-8-9 as a unit, competition in those grades between other Junior Highs within the city and nearby area is recommended, rather than encouraging children at the Junior High School level to seek membership on the regular high school team. ~~In the event 7th and 8th grade students are placed on a ninth grade team that has been declared a high school team, they will remain eligible for junior high competition. Should a 7th or 8th grader be placed on a team consisting of tenth graders or higher, they will no longer be eligible for junior high competition. However, such students are eligible for participation on the high school team, but if once elevated to a high school team are no longer eligible for the junior high team in that sport during that sport season. NOTE: The exception to this rule is in the sports of track, cross-country, golf and wrestling for all schools as well as in all sports for schools with a combined enrollment of less than 50 in the 7th and 8th grade. (Board approved June 2004)~~

~~The total enrollment count must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule is applied.~~

If a junior high student is elevated and participates in high school competition they shall be able to move back to junior high competition.

Care should be exercised that dual participation on two school teams does not result in "over" participation. Individual and team limits as spelled out in sport/activity regulations shall be administered. School administrators and coaches who permit this dual participation membership must assume the responsibility of preventing over-participation.

4. Q: Are there any conditions under which a fifth or sixth grader may be a member of a high school team?

A: No, not under the present rules and regulations. However, it is possible for him/her to be a member of a junior high team if the enrollment in grades 7 and 8 is less than 50 is not over fifty (50) with the exception of football and wrestling.

The total enrollment count must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule is applied.

PART FIVE - JUNIOR HIGH AND SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADE BY-LAWS – ARTICLE III: GENERAL REGULATIONS - OTHER REGULATIONS (Page 3 of Part V-Other Regulations: Guidelines for Jr High Competition)

General Statement:

In the junior high school if the 9th graders are kept separate for competition and teams are composed strictly of 9th graders, the regulations for each sport are exactly the same as they are for high school teams. Whenever a team is composed of students from grades 7-8-9, 8-9, 7-8, or 7-9 these teams are limited to regulations pertaining to junior high school teams.

GUIDELINES FOR JUNIOR HIGH COMPETITION

~~1. Member schools with teams in both junior and senior high school may select pupils in grades 7, 8 or 9 for either junior high teams or as members of high school teams.~~

~~1.2. Seventh and eighth grade students who participate on a ninth grade team declared for high school status may still be eligible for 7th or 8th grade competition.~~ If a junior high student is elevated and participates in high school competition they shall be able to move back to junior high competition.

~~2.3. A team made up of a combination of 7th and 8th grade students is considered a junior high team and is subject to those limitations as outlined in the By-Laws. Seventh and eighth grade students elevated to teams consisting of any grades 10 through 12 are no longer eligible for junior high competition.~~ Seventh and eighth grade students may be "moved up" to a high school team.

~~3.4. A ninth grade team may be declared for junior high status or high school status and that team must maintain that status the entire season. Ninth grade teams choosing high school status must be comprised of at least 50% ninth grade students.~~

~~5. A combination junior high team (8 and 9 or 7, 8 and 9) may compete against a ninth grade team if such combination team has been designated as a high school team. Reference Section XIII~~

~~6. Ninth grade teams that have declared high school status MUST follow high school limitations. They must be designated as a high school team when the season begins so it is clear they cannot compete against teams with junior high status.~~

~~4.7. If a combination team (8 and 9 or 7, 8 and 9) has less than 50% ninth grade students, that team cannot declare high school status and must follow junior high limitations.~~

~~5.8. All Jr. High seasons shall be no longer than the high school season in that sport. No Jr. High participant may participate in a total number of consecutive weeks in excess of the number of weeks established for the high school season.~~

~~9. The total enrollment count applicable to 50 or less enrollment regulations must take place at the beginning of each season in which this rule applies.~~

Motion by Helvik to approve. Second by Brannan. Motion carried unanimously.

The Constitution & By-Laws Committee recommended a change in the format of the By-Laws as per the NDHSAA Strategic Plan.

Motion by Martin to approve. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a letter from Dr. Hamid Shirvani, NDUS Chancellor and Kirsten Baesler, State Superintendent with a recommendation from the ND State Board of Higher Ed/NDUS/DPI the Board

strongly recommend coaches to complete the NFHS course titled "Creating a Safe and Respectful Environment".

Baesler indicated this was a request from Governor Dalrymple to Baesler and Shirvani to address bullying or abuse by coaches and/or officials. No legislation was introduced at the current session to have mandatory reporting of abuse and bullying by coaches and officials. Along with Coaches Certification being implemented both would like to see this as a link and a suggestion for schools on our Coaches Education page.

Motion by Helvik to approve addition of the recommendation to complete the "Creating a Safe and Respectful Environment" course as a recommended course on the NDHSAA Coaching Permit. Second by Olson.

Discussion indicated there are no recommendations on the current Coaching Permit checklist, only requirements. With the initial implementation of Coaches Education there is confusion among schools exactly what is required. It would add additional confusion to start adding recommendations at this time.

Motion rescinded by Helvik. Olson rescinded second.

Motion by Ham to approve the request by providing messages to our schools and a link on our website stating "In cooperation with ND DPS and NDUS, NDHSAA recommends the following course "Creating a Safe and Respectful Environment"."Second by Wiberg. Motion carried unanimously.

Justin Fletschock spoke to the Board regarding a request to move the 2013-14 gymnastics season one week later. Opening Date would be November 18, 2013 with the first allowable meet December 2, 2013.

Motion by Roaldson to approve. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

A letter was received and read as Board correspondence from Angela Moser, Medina concerning a possible coop.

In representative reports:

- Martin brought up a concern in his area about the sport regulation of meets/games held 2 days followed by a school day for spring sport contests due to the late spring.
 - Motion by Helvik to approve a waiver of regulation that states no more than 2 days followed by a school day to all spring sports excluding soccer. Second by Wiberg. Motion carried unanimously.
 - Motion by Olson to waive the 4 match in 7-day regulation and 8 halves in 7 days regulation in girls' soccer for 12/13. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.
- Brannan requested clarification on the change of Class B Golf region sites. Staff member Fetsch indicated Class B Golf region sites are approved each year.
- Olson suggested this be our last television contract and we move to media contracts in the future.
- Baesler thanked the Executive Secretary for the follow up response on the Grand Forks Red River students who acted inappropriately at the state hockey tournament. Baesler shared that response with many interested parties. Baesler also shared disappointment in the actions of fans watching region basketball tournaments.
 - Sylling noted student sections at tournaments will be addressed at the next tournament committee meeting.
 - Roaldson asked the North Dakota School Boards Association to recognize and support Athletic Director positions at member schools.
 - Auch will carry that message back to the North Dakota School Boards Association.
- Wiberg indicated at region volleyball in Devils Lake he removed some students. He talked to the administrators of their schools and to the students involved concerning appropriate behavior. He indicated if there were additional issues, they would be handled by law enforcement.
- Roaldson suggested large teams in girls' hockey look at splitting their coops to allow more teams to be competitive.
- Auch reported the School Boards Association offered an amendment to Senate Bill 1028 concerning concussions (to clean up the bill language). Senators wanted to add mandatory reporting. Auch testified NDHSAA is currently doing a concussion survey of member schools at the end of each year. Legislators would appreciate receiving the survey results.

- Helvik spoke about the need for young officials.
- Ulland reported the club hockey team in Mayville-Portland asked him if the NDHSAA Board ever considered two tiers of hockey.
- Ulland voiced his opinion on some issues with officials. Officials and some of the issues schools experience with officials was discussed at the District Chair meeting, mainly the use of 3-man crews. May-Port CG pays only for a 2-man crew and contracts the majority of their officials through the Grand Forks Association. However, officials are holding schools hostage and not allowing schools to use 2-man crews. In Ulland's opinion, he does not think NDOA is promoting this practice, but they are condoning it. When contracting officials through the Fargo Association, inexperienced officials are sent out if a 2-man crew is used. The older more experienced officials are not interested in working a game with a 2-man crew. Officials need to look at a mentoring system to assist new officials when they first start officiating.

Executive Secretary Sylling shared a letter mailed to Red River High School after the ND State Hockey Tournament concerning the actions of a portion of their student body. In their investigation, it was determined students wore inappropriate attire for approximately 30 seconds to one minute during the State Hockey Tournament. Inappropriate attire was removed by said students upon the urging of other Red River High School students. The school indicated they received calls from each student's parents and met with each student/family. As per Red River High School policy, students that are disruptive and inappropriate may be penalized by out of school suspension, suspension from events, student education and student apology. Due to privacy issues, the school was not at liberty to expand on the penalties assessed to each student. Red River High School indicated any sportsmanship issues will be addressed and they are committed to the NDHSAA Code of Conduct. They assured NDHSAA they were extremely disappointed in the actions of these students.

If board is comfortable then no further action need be taken. Recommend the board accept their action report.

Motion by Auch to approve. Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

Sylling reported all staff offers for 2013/14 were acceptable.

Anderson indicated WDAY TV is happy to be back broadcasting NDHSAA events. The Board reviewed the television contract as presented. Anderson addressed any questions from the Board.

Targeted bulleted points from the March meeting were addressed.

- Language was added to include "in a timely manner" for response time for tournament management concerning ideal timelines.

- Language was added to provide copies of televised games to NDHSAA for archival purposes to include “not for re-sale. Any use by other media outlets once this contract has ended, Forum Communications Company will be given credit in any usage, television, web, etc. “
- Language was added to public service announcements to include “produce and” provide and also “and promotional” announcements.
- Language was revised concerning the streaming of games during a televised tournament game to include “NDHSAA will not allow other media outlets to televise or stream games during their broadcast. If Forum Communications is not televising a state basketball tournament game, NDHSAA will be allowed to authorize televising a regional basketball tournament game(s).”

It was noted the proposed contract contains no webcasting rights. Concern was voiced by not allowing other media outlets to televise or stream games during the broadcast of a tournament game, NDHSAA would not be allowed to stream any other games at the time of a broadcast tournament. Sylling indicated Forum Communications does not view NDHSAA as a media outlet, there for only other media outlets would be covered by this point. Games streamed on NDHSAA would not be included. The media committee reinforced NDHSAA’s streaming rights for tournaments are maintained through this agreement. If NDHSAA were to hire a media company to stream tournaments, they would be considered a media outlet. Currently the Metro Tournament Committee, Bismarck Public Schools, Minot Public Schools webstream non-broadcast tournament games and they would not be considered media outlets. The television contract as presented protects profitability for Forum Communications Company and maintains accessibility for NDHSAA. Forum Communications Company is willing to collaborate with NDHSAA on webstreaming.

Motion by Helvik to accept the television contract as presented. Second by Martin. Roll Call Vote: Olson - yes, Auch - yes, Roaldson - yes, Martin - yes, Ham - yes, Brannan - yes, Helvik - yes, Hall - yes, Wiberg - yes, Baesler - yes, Ulland – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Ulland thanked the crew from Forum Communications, WDAY TV and the media committee for the positive undertaking for our association and the kids of North Dakota.

Sylling recommended moving the 2014/15 boys’ soccer season one week earlier. Currently approved 2014 boys’ soccer state tournament dates conflict with proposed NDCEL and NDEA conferences.

Motion by Olson to move the 2014/15 boys’ soccer season one week earlier. Second by Wiberg. Motion carried unanimously.

Calendar dates for 2017/18 were added to the calendar previously approved through 2016-17.

Motion by Wiberg to approve proposed calendar dates for 2017/18. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

Larry Helvik, realignment committee chair provided the Board with a report concerning discussion of Class B districts and regions for basketball and volleyball. The realignment committee recommended creating a concept survey of schools for use in realignment of districts. Also discussed was the concept of a 2 year realignment plan similar to the football plan. The realignment committee may look at downsizing some regions so all regions have 14 or 15 teams. One option is to move to 8 districts with 14 or 15 teams in each district along with balancing the teams. Consensus was to allow Region 7 to conduct their current 2-year experiment with a super region and evaluate at the end of their experiment. There may be a need to rebalance districts before we have a complete overhaul of districts and regions. The committee recommends preparing a survey to send to schools before the end of school to gather information. NDHSAA staff will create the survey and obtain approval from the realignment committee before the survey is sent to schools.

Motion by Auch to approve the realignment committee report. Second by Olson. Motion carried unanimously.

Ben Auch, promotions and programs committee chair, made a recommendation to deny a Distinguished Service Award.

Motion by Helvik to approve the promotions & programs committee report. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Hall, tournament committee chair reported the actions of the Combined Tournament Committee at the April 10, 2013 meeting.

Committee recommendation to charge admission for region and state golf and tennis tournaments beginning in 2013/14 and to work with venues concerning implementation.

The ticket price recommendation similar to other sports, are as follows:

- State Golf--\$7 adults and \$4 students
- Regional Golf--\$7 adults and \$4 students
- State Tennis--\$7 adults and \$4 students
- Regional Tennis--\$7 adults and \$4 students

Motion by Martin to approve the tickets prices as presented. Second by Auch.

Discussion included the logistics of implementation and the rationale for the prices recommended. Logistics will have to be addressed with tournament managers. The ticket prices are similar to other region and state events. Tennis and golf are the only sporting events not currently charging admission. Motion carried.

Committee recommendation to make the following site changes

- 2013/14 State Girls' Tennis Tournament from Minot to Bismarck
- 2013/14 State Gymnastics Tournament from Minot to Bismarck
- 2012/13 State A Boys' Golf Tournament from Grand Forks to Hankinson

Motion by Roaldson to approve recommended site changes. Second by Helvik. Motion carried unanimously.

Recommend tournament policy manual include the requirement of fans at region and state tournaments to be in bleachers and not on the floor under baskets or volleyball end zones. Issues were created at 2012/13 region and state tournaments by having the fans too close to the court.

Motion by Helvik to approve requiring fans to be in the bleachers at region and state tournaments. Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

The Combined Tournament Committee recommended the elimination of pre-tournament shoot-arounds and hit-arounds prior to the start of state tournaments for volleyball and basketball. This was placed on the Combined Tournament Committee agenda as per the request of prior Board action concerning a letter from an administrator at Century High School in Bismarck.

Motion by Ham to approve the elimination of shoot-arounds for basketball and pre-tournament hit-arounds for volleyball prior to the start of the state tournaments. Second by Martin. Discussion: This would eliminate all shoot-arounds and hit-arounds on Thursday, however it would allow shoot-arounds and hit-arounds after the first day of the tournament. Comments were made not all Class B coaches and athletic directors want this approved as not all Class B schools make it to region and state every year. Some schools would like to have this under local control.

Roll Call Vote: Auch - yes, Roaldson - yes, Ham - yes, Olson - yes, Brannan - yes, Martin - yes, Wiberg - yes, Helvik - no, Hall - yes, Baesler - yes, Ulland – yes. Motion carried. (10-1)

A letter from Curt Jones, West Fargo High School requesting the Board consider moving spring tournaments later into the summer was discussed.

An email was also submitted by Curt Jones, West Fargo High School stating with the late request the likelihood of extending spring seasons this spring would be slim but has future recommendations to move the state tournament start dates for track, girls' soccer, baseball, softball and spring golf no earlier than the first Thursday in June and girls' tennis state tournament no earlier than one week before the other tournaments.

Motion by Ham to deny request to extend spring tournaments for 2012/13 and study alternatives for future changes looking for possible conflicts with facilities, coaches and other activities/functions. Second by Helvik.

Discussion:

The southwest and northeast areas are opposed to extending the 2012/13 seasons. This would have a huge impact on tournament venues, managers, workers and hosts, summer school, summer maintenance schedules, outside entities such as FFA, Boys' State, Girls' State, Governor's School, Teaching and Technology Conference, continuing education plans, and family vacations. This would put schools in a bind for contract extensions for coaches. Extending the seasons would not solve the problem created by Mother Nature.

Roll Call Vote:, Olson - yes, Auch - yes, Roaldson - yes, Martin - yes, Ham - yes, Brannan - yes, Helvik - yes, Hall - yes, Wiberg - yes, Baesler - yes, Ulland – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Jason Wiberg provided a report of the tournament site recommendations for 2013-14. A change in the dates for the Region 2 Boys' Basketball Tournament was recommended due to a facility conflict at the Betty Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks. Date change from February 24, 25, 27, 2014 to February 24, 25, 28, 2014.

Motion by Olson to change Region Boys' basketball dates for Region 2 to February 24, 25, 28, 2014. Second by Helvik. Motion carried unanimously.

The placement of the Region 3 boys' basketball tournament was questioned. The placement of region tournaments are based on recommendations from each district. If districts do not agree on the region site, the decision is left to the NDHSAA Board.

NDSCS is the recommendation for the girls' basketball Region 1 tournament. The districts did not agree. The recommendation is to choose the larger venue.

Recommendation to hold the first two nights of the Region 6 Girls' Basketball Tournament at the Minot Auditorium with the championship night at Minot High School due to a conflict with the State A Boys' & Girls' State tourney.

Motion by Martin to approve moving third night of the Region 6 Girls' Basketball Tournament to Minot High School (March 13, 2014). Second by Auch. Motion carried unanimously.

The Region 5 volleyball tournament received two invitations. The more centrally located location is recommended.

Motion by Brannan to approve the tournament committee report. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

Central Cass High School requested a waiver of a speech regulation. By regulation, students are limited to the number of events they may qualify for at the state meet. The regulation also states even if a student pre-qualifies for a category, the student must participate in the category they pre-qualified in at the region meet. Casselton had a student that pre-qualified for a category and did not enter the same category he/she pre-qualified in for region speech.

Motion by Martin to deny request made by Central Cass High School to allow a waiver of the speech regulations. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

Upon analysis of MVP and NDHSAA websites by the Arizona Interscholastic Association, Brian Bolitho, AIA Director of Business Media and Jason Urasky, AIA programmer, recommended a remake of the NDHSAA and MVP websites with a common code base for the NDHSAA to manage and control. This opportunity would allow the NDHSAA to start with a modern framework allowing easier management and user interface. As previously directed by the Board, Sylling met with the Arizona Executive Director to contract for services to aid in the creation of a website redesign. AIA will charge us a maximum flat fee of \$27,500 to develop what we need. Maintenance costs would be agreed upon at completion. NDHSAA staff will determine what is needed and identify domain names. The plan includes a minimum of two websites. What is maintained on each site will be determined by collaboration with NDHSAA staff and AIA programmers. This is in line with our Strategic Plan. If the need is there, money can be obtained out of our reserves. AIA was confident a revision could be realized by August 1, 2013.

Motion by Auch to approve agreement with the Arizona Interscholastic Association for \$27,500 to re-develop the NDHSAA websites. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

Board correspondence included a letter from Sue DuBois regarding state boys' and girls' basketball tournaments.

In representative reports:

- Martin would like to invite ND Special Olympics to a future Board meeting to discuss the letter received in October concerning inclusion of special education students into sports and activities.
- Ham would like to see conversations regarding summer coaching and the definition of what constitutes a camp.
- Baelser indicated Senate Bill 2320 passed changing law enforcement reporting to schools of other offenses, specifically sexual offenses, from a "may report" to a "shall report". Law enforcement must now report sexual offense charges to schools. Century Code (12.1-32-15) Recommendation to refer to the Constitution & By-Laws committee.
- Brannan commented the northwest region suggested it is time for girls' and boys' Class B golf to move to the fall.
- Olson questioned why we are in the business of dictating what is done in schools in June and July. Suggested NDHSAA take a serious look at summer regulations.

Executive Secretary's Report

- AIG issued a catastrophic insurance refund for 2009/10 of \$10,183.35. If claims are down, NDHSAA receives a rebate and the claims were lower in 2009/10. NDHSAA also received a refund from NDIRF for \$2,748.
- A letter was sent to a school concerning sportsmanship at a state tournament. The school responded by thanking NDHSAA for the letter. This letter will assist them in implementing the changes needed. No recommended changes in action by the Board will indicate acceptance.
- Allegations of racial slurs at the State B Girls' Tournament were reported. Sylling contacted schools involved requesting investigation into the allegations. Upon Sylling's request, both schools conducted investigations including phone conversation with the Superintendent from the other school, email statement from tournament managers, conversations with tournament workers. As a result of the investigation, there was no proof of racial slurs coming from the current student body of the schools implicated.
- Sylling will be receiving a request from a member school to investigate an allegation of the use of an ineligible player by another member school.
- NFHS Network report.
 - NFHS Network is a webcasting network patterned after the Big 10 Network. NFHS is requesting NDHSAA allow Tier 2 rights to the NFHS Network. That would include webstreaming of anything not covered by the NDHSAA television contract. NFHS Network was approved by the NFHS Board, providing 26 states initially sign on. The NFHS Network would gain 30% of revenues from sponsorship and 70% of revenues from subscriptions. NDHSAA would receive an annual rights payment of \$35,000 for years one through three. After years one through three there would be a percentage of the entire contract based on a previously agreed upon formula.
 - The NFHS Network contract would be with Play-on Sports. A limited liability corporation is being formed made up of state associations and the NFHS. Legal review of those documents will be completed by each state before finalization. This would fit into the NDHSAA strategic plan. Final approval for NDHSAA to join the NFHS Network will be on the June agenda. Contracts will be reviewed by legal counsel before presentation to the Board.
 - NDHSAA would retain rights to any events not chosen to be put into the NFHS Network

Next Meeting June 18-19, 2013 in the Valley City Office with retirement supper held on June 18th.

Lakota High School requested a waiver of the coop naming policy. Motion by Olson to approve request to waive cooperative sponsorship name policy. Second by Baesler. Discussion included the NDHSAA coop name policy, what it consists of and why it exists. Motion failed unanimously.

Gackle-Streeter High School requested the Board waive the late fee for coop applications in boys' basketball, girls' basketball and volleyball. Motion by Roaldson to waive late fee for boys' basketball, girls' basketball and volleyball coops. Second by Olson. Roll call vote. Ulland - yes, Olson - yes, Roaldson - yes, Martin - yes, Ham - yes, Brannan - yes, Hall - yes, Wiberg - yes, Baesler - yes. Motion carried unanimously.

David Rudolph, Playon Sports made a presentation to the Board concerning the concept and details of the NFHS Network. NDHSAA has an opportunity to join the NFHS Network for webcasting purposes. Sylling recommended the board wait until day two of the Board meeting to act on this issue in order to review legal counsel's evaluation of the contract for the NFHS Network. NDHSAA legal counsel Gary Thune's letter was reviewed as was a letter from Derrick Bulawa, BEK Sports, concerning the proposed NFHS Network agreement. Joining the NFHS Network would allow NDHSAA to service users outside of the state of North Dakota, supplying our product to as many people as possible through webcasting. Ham made a motion to approve the agreement with the NFHS Network and Playon Sports, contingent on working out the indemnification clause in the agreement. Second by Olson. Sylling indicated this agreement was in alignment of our Strategic Plan.

Roll call vote: Olson - yes, Roaldson - yes, Ham - yes, Hall - yes, Wiberg - yes, Brannan - yes, Baesler - yes, Martin - yes, Ulland - yes. Motion carried unanimously.

Olson reported on the Class A Review meeting held May 8th via conference call. Class A review supports the elimination of regional baseball trophies beginning in 2013-14. The association does not provide softball trophies and NDHSAA has no financial involvement in baseball region tournaments so the trophies should not be the responsibility of NDHSAA. This change would align baseball with other sports.

Motion by Roaldson to approve elimination of payment of NDHSAA sponsored trophies for all classes of region baseball tournaments . Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

Class A Review discussed the impact of moving spring sports calendar a week later as per a request from West Fargo High School. No recommendation was made at this time.

Class A Review is in support of raising the number of Class A regular season basketball games from 19 to 21. Motion by Martin to accept the Class A Review report. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

Mark Anderson, general manager and Brad Nold, claims manager from Farmers Union Insurance addressed the board on the corporate structure of Farmers Union Insurance and thanked the Board for the premier partner sponsorship. Anderson indicated Farmers Union Insurance is always ready to talk to NDHSAA about the next phase of support.

Olson gave a realignment committee report of Class B basketball and volleyball district/region realignments. The committee suggests an early fall distribution of the proposed realignments with decision in September.

Stanley High School was assigned to the north region for softball and Thompson High School was moved from the north region to the south region. Motion by Wiberg to approve the realignment committee report. Second by Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

Catastrophic insurance proposal from Dissinger/Reed, insurance company that serves as broker for NDHSAA was reviewed. NDHSAA provides catastrophic coverage for students in grades 7-12 for all member schools. Two options were presented for consideration. A proposal from AIG and a proposal from Mutual of Omaha. Upon comparison, Sylling recommended the Mutual of Omaha policy for \$46,947.75/year for 2013/14 and 2014/15.

Motion by Brannan to approve the recommendation to contract with Mutual of Omaha for catastrophic insurance policy for our schools for the next two years at \$46,947.75/year. Second by Martin. Roll vote: Wiberg – yes, Olson - yes, Ham - yes, Martin - yes, Ulland - yes, Brannan - yes, Hall - yes, Roaldson - yes, Baesler – yes. Motion carried unanimously.

The 2013-14 budget was presented by Executive Secretary Sylling and recommended by the Finance Committee. Wiberg moved to approve the 2013-14 budget. Second by Brannan. Motion carried unanimously.

Staff member Schell provided a website project update progress report to the Board. The website redesign is in progress as per the agreement with the Arizona Interscholastic Association. The website redesign will combine the information currently within our public website and MVP into one site with a password protected area for school administrators, coaches, officials and NDHSAA staff to input information. Another site will take the current information in NDHSAA.com and port it to a new site that is geared toward more immediate information for member schools, fans and media. The timeline for project completion is August 1, 2013. Motion by Roaldson to approve the technology report. Second by Wiberg. Motion carried unanimously.

Staff member Schell, presented the 2013-14 Technology Plan for approval. Motion by Ham to approve the 2013/14 Technology Plan as presented. Second by Roaldson. Motion carried unanimously.

Jack Maus, Superintendent, Grafton, requested the board to adjust the schedule and site for Region II boys' basketball tournament. Motion by Ham to deny request to change the dates and site for the Region II boys' basketball tournament. Second by Olson. Motion carried unanimously.

Luke Schaefer, Mid-Dakota Education Cooperative requested the board to waive the requirement to use NFHS courses for coaches certification for coaches who attend live, face-to-face sessions with similar learning outcomes and time requirements. Motion by Roaldson to deny the MDEC request to waive the NFHS Concussion in Sport course requirement for coaches education. Second by Martin. Motion carried unanimously.

Class A West Athletic Directors requested the Board move the site for the 2013-14 West region hockey from Bismarck to Minot. Motion by Olson to move the 2013/14 West region hockey site from Bismarck to Minot. Second by Wiberg. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a proposed concussion policy for member schools to utilize when dealing with concussions. The concussion policy was adjusted by NDHSAA staff to meet State Law. Motion by Roaldson to approve the adjusted concussion policy. Second by Ham. Motion carried unanimously.

Scott Ulland provided an Executive Board report on the following items:

1. New Town HS eligibility violation – New Town had a transfer from Standing Rock and both parents did move lock stock and barrel. New Town will forfeit all individual points earned by the ineligible student in cross country and adjust team points accordingly. The student was

not allowed to play varsity basketball so no violation occurred in basketball. Letter of reprimand was issued and New Town High School was put on probation for one year.

2. Emergency soccer coop application between Kidder County Steele and Bismarck Century High School. The coop was approved by the Executive Board and passed through to the Board for approval.

Motion by Wiberg to approve Executive Board report. Second by Olson. Motion carried unanimously.

Steve Hall, Committee Chair, provided a report on the Constitution & By-Laws Committee on the following items:

1. Began discussion on the eligibility of convicted sex offenders.
2. Reviewed an inquiry from a school wondering when a new high school opens in a city if a student would be eligible to move to a private school within the city with multiple high schools. Recommendation to leave the guideline interpretation as is.
3. The committee is working on updating academic eligibility changes to our By-Laws due to different learning opportunities now available to students. A meeting has been set for the end of July to continue discussions. Representatives of the ND High School Principals Association will be included in this discussion.

Motion by Martin to approve Constitution & By-Laws committee report. Second by Olson. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Olson, football committee chair, provided a report on the development of guidelines and timelines for the next two-year football plan. Staff member Fetsch was directed to create a survey for member schools this coming fall with results shared with member schools at the general assembly meeting in October. Bismarck Public Schools submitted a plan for the implementation of sports and activities at the new Legacy High School, which will open in the fall of 2015.

Reviewed a letter from Coaches Choice indicating their pleasure with our current plan and indicating an interest in expanding their presence.

The Executive Secretary reported on the Strategic Plan update. In the past year, NDHSAA has addressed most of the items targeted in our strategic plan. Updates will continue to be available.

Report on Financial Statements

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
JUNE 30, 2013**

1. DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues, sponsorships, and sales and charges at athletic events.

General and administrative activities include the functions necessary to provide support the Association's program activities. General and administrative activities include those that provide governance (Board of Directors), oversight, business management, financial recordkeeping, budgeting, legal services, human resource management, and similar activities that ensure an adequate working environment and an equitable employment program.

Fundraising activities include publicizing and conducting fundraising campaigns, maintaining donor lists, conducting special fundraising events; and other activities involved with soliciting contributions from corporations, foundations, individuals and others.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Association maintains its records on the modified cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. On an ongoing basis, the Association's management evaluates the estimates and assumptions based upon historical experience and various other factors and circumstances; however, the actual results could differ from those estimates.

NET ASSETS

The financial statements report net assets and changes in net assets in three classes that are based upon the existence or absence of restrictions on use that are placed by its donors as follows:

UNRESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Unrestricted net assets are resources available to support operations. The only limits on the use of unrestricted net assets are the broad limits resulting from the nature of the organization, the environment in which it operates, the purposes specified in corporate documents and its application for tax-exempt status, and any limits resulting from contractual agreements with creditors and others that are entered into in the course of its operations.

TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Temporarily restricted net assets are resources that are restricted by a donor for use for a particular purpose or in a particular future period. The Association's unspent contributions are classified in this class if the donor limited their use, as are unspent appreciation of its donor restricted endowment funds.

When a donor's restriction is satisfied, either by using the resources in the manner specified by the donor or by the passage of time, the expiration of the restriction is reported in the financial statements by reclassifying the net assets from temporarily restricted to unrestricted net assets. Net assets restricted for acquisition of buildings or equipment are reported as temporarily restricted until the specified asset is placed in service by the Association, unless the donor provides more specific directions about the period of its use.

PERMANENTLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Permanently restricted net assets are resources whose use by the Association is limited by donor-imposed restrictions that neither expire by being used in accordance with a donor's restriction nor by the passage of time. The portion of the Association's donor restricted endowment funds that must be maintained in perpetuity are classified in this net asset class.

All revenues and net gains are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets in the statement of activities unless the use of the related resources is subject to temporary or permanent donor restrictions. All expenses and net losses other than losses on endowment investments are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets. Net losses on endowment investments reduce temporarily restricted net assets to the extent that net gains of the fund from prior years are unspent and classified there; remaining losses are classified in decreases in unrestricted net assets. If an endowment fund has no net gains from prior years, such as when a fund is newly established, net losses are classified as decreases in unrestricted net assets.

CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash equivalents are short term interest bearing highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, unless the investments are held for meeting restrictions of a capital or endowment nature.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable are primarily unsecured non-interest bearing amounts due from grantors on cost reimbursement or performance grants. Management believes that all outstanding accounts receivable are collectible in full, therefore no allowance for uncollected receivables has been provided.

SHORT TERM INVESTMENTS

The Association invests cash in excess of its immediate needs in money market funds. Short term investments are reported at fair value.

The investment policy specific to these investments is monitored by the Finance Committee.

INVENTORIES

Inventories of food are stated at the lower of cost or market using the first-in, first-out method.

CONTRIBUTIONS RECEIVABLE

Contributions receivable are unconditional promises to give that are recognized as contributions when the promise is received. Contributions receivable that are expected to be collected in less than one year are reported at net realizable value. Contribution receivables that are expected to be collected in more than one year are recorded at fair value at the date of promise. That fair value is computed using a present value technique applied to anticipated cash flows. Amortization of the resulting discount is recognized as additional contribution revenue. The allowance for uncollectible contributions receivable is determined based on management's evaluation of the collectibility of individual promises. Promises that remain uncollected more than one year after their due dates are written off unless the donors indicate the payment is merely postponed.

LAND BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Land, buildings and equipment are reported in the balance sheet at cost, if purchased, and at fair value at the date of donation, if donated. All land and buildings are capitalized. Equipment is capitalized if it has a cost of \$1,000 or more and a useful life when acquired of more than one year. Repairs and maintenance that do not significantly increase the useful life of the assets are expensed as incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset as follows:

Buildings and improvements	40 years
Leasehold improvements	5-20 years
Equipment	3-15 years

ACCOUNTING FOR CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized when received. All contributions are recorded as increases in unrestricted net assets unless use of contributed assets is specifically restricted by donor. Amounts received that are restricted by the donor to use in future periods or for specific purposes are reported as increases in either temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets, consistent with the nature of the restrictions. Unconditional promises with payments due in future years have an implied restriction to be used in the year the payment is due, and therefore are reported as temporarily restricted until the payment is due unless the contribution is clearly intended to support activities of the current fiscal year or is received with permanent restrictions. Conditional promises, such as matching grants, are not recognized until they become unconditional, that is, until all conditions on which they depend are substantially met.

GIFTS-IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

The Association periodically receives contributions in a form other than cash and investments. If the Association receives a contribution of land, buildings, or equipment the contributed asset is recognized as an asset at its estimated fair value at the date of the gift, provided that the value of the asset and its estimated useful life meets the Association's capitalization policy. Donated use of facilities is reported as contribution and expense at the estimated fair value of for rent under similar circumstances. Donated supplies are recorded as contributions at the date of the gift and as expenses when the donated items are placed into service or distributed.

The Association benefits from personal services provided by a substantial amount of volunteers. Those volunteers have donated significant amounts of time and services in the Association's program operations. However, the majority of the contributed services do not meet the criteria for recognition in the financial statements. GAAP allow the recognition of contributed services only if (a)the services create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b)the services would have been purchased if not provided by the contribution, require specialized skills, and are provided by individuals possessing those skills.

GRANT REVENUE

Grant revenue is recognized when the qualifying costs are incurred for cost reimbursement grants or contracts or when a unit of service is provided for performance grants. Grant revenue from Federal agencies is subject to independent audit under the Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133 and review by grantor agencies. The review could result in the disallowance of expenditures under the terms of the grant or reductions of future grant funds. Based on prior experience, the Association's management believes that any costs disallowed would not materially affect the financial position of the Association.

EXPENSE RECOGNITION AND ALLOCATION

The cost of providing the Association's programs and other activities is summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and statement of functional activities. Expenses that can be identified with a specific program or support service are charged directly to that program or support service. Costs common to multiple functions have been allocated among the various functions benefitted.

General and administrative expenses include those costs that are not directly identifiable with any specific program, but which provide for overall support and direction of the Association.

Fundraising costs are expensed as incurred, even though they may result in contributions received in future years. The Association generally does not conduct its fundraising activities in conjunction with its other activities. In the few cases in which it does, joint costs have been allocated between

fundraising and management and general expenses in accordance with standards for accounting for cost of activities that include fundraising. Additionally, advertising costs are expenses as incurred.

TAX STATUS

The Association is incorporated exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), though it would be subject to tax on income unrelated to its exempt purposes (unless otherwise exempted by the IRC). The tax years of 2013, 2012, and 2011 are still open to audit for federal purposes. Contributions to the Association are tax deductible to donors under Section 170 of the IRC. The Association is not classified as a private foundation.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Association reports its fair value measures using a three-level hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. This hierarchy, established by GAAP, requires that entities maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value are as follows:

Level 1. Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets to which the Association has access at the measurement date.

Level 2. Inputs, other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. Level 2 inputs include

1- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

2- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active;

3- observable inputs other than quoted prices for the asset or liability (for example, interest rates and yield curves); and

4- inputs derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or by other means.

Level 3. Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability. Unobservable inputs should be used to measure the fair value to the extent that observable inputs are not available.

When available, the Association measures fair value using level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. However, level 1 inputs are not available for all of the assets and liabilities that the organization is required to measure at fair value (for example in-kind contributions).

The primary uses of fair value measures in the Association's financial statements are:

I- Initial measurement of noncash gifts

II- recurring measurement of short term investments

4. INVESTMENTS

Investments consist of the following at June 30, 2013:

Short term investments: \$277,545

As discussed in Note 3 to these financial statements, the Association is required to report its fair value measurements in one of three levels, which are based on the ability to observe in the marketplace the inputs to the Association's valuation techniques. Level 1, the most observable level of inputs, is for investments measured at quoted prices in active markets for identical investments as of June 30, 2013. Level 2 is for investments measured using inputs such as quoted prices for similar assets, quoted prices for the identical assets in inactive markets, and for investments measured at net asset value that can be redeemed in the near future. Level 3 is for investments measured using inputs that are unobservable, and is used in situations for which there is little, if any, market activity for investments.

The Association uses the following ways to determine the fair value of its investments:

Money market funds: Determined by the published net asset value per unit at the end of the last trading day of the year, which is the basis for transactions at that date.

6. RETIREMENT PLAN

The Association participates in a defined contribution, individual account, money purchase, retirement plan that covers all employees who work over 20 hours per week.

In accordance with the plan agreement, the Association contributes 16.8 percent of the employee's gross wages to the plan. During the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Association contributed \$91,936 and \$93,726 respectively, to the retirement plan.

7. CONCENTRATIONS OF RISK

Amounts held in financial institutions occasionally are in excess of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and Securities Investor Protection Corporation limits. The Association deposits its cash with high quality financial institutions, and management believes the Association is not exposed to significant credit risk on those amounts.

A significant portion of the Association's annual funding comes from events and media for the programs operated.

8. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through July 21, 2013, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Events occurring after that date have not been evaluated to determine whether a change in financial statements would be required.
