FOREWORD

This yearbook provides a detailed accounting of the past years' activities for the NDHSAA. I would like to thank the Board of Directors, NDHSAA office staff and all representatives of the member schools for your dedication and commitment to the Association.

Farmers Union Insurance has completed its ninth year as the Premiere Partner of NDHSAA and continues to be actively involved in all activities. Their entire company has demonstrated a commitment to the enhancement of activities for North Dakota students and once again provided \$5,000 in scholarship funds for the NDHSAA Distinguished Student Program. The Association is very appreciative for what they do for the athletes and fine arts students in North Dakota.

The North Dakota National Guard has been a supporting sponsor of NDHSAA sponsored activities for the past eight years. We appreciate the demonstrated support of the Guard, as well as the North Dakota Department of Transportation, who completed their fourth year as a supporting sponsor. They have a great safety message and we are able to help promote that message.

Some highlights from the 2016-17 school year include:

*The first full year of an Association Media Specialist. The addition of the position has proved to be a huge success for member schools, fans, and media outlets across the state.

*The top five teams in a majority of Class B state tournaments were seeded prior to the tournament for the first time. During the previous three years the top four teams were seeded and the remaining four randomly drawn.

*The implementation of a pitch count regulation for baseball that was used during the 2017 season.

Once again, the NDHSAA served a large number of students in grades seven through twelve. The most recent completed survey indicates there were 26,582 student participants in sports activities and 14,359 student participants in fine arts activities. The Association once again experienced a successful fiscal year, as gross admission records were set during the Dakota Bowl Football Championships, Class B Boys Basketball Tournament, State Track & Field Meet, and both the Boys and Girls State Soccer Tournaments. \$350,000 was distributed to member schools through the team payment program at the conclusion of the 2016-17 school year. Distribution has totaled more than \$1.07 million of distribution over the past three years.

The NDHSAA continues to be a very successful organization that serves North Dakota students who wish to be involved in educationally based activities. It is important that each member school feels as though they are an important part of the Association. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Andy Dahlen, Football Committee Chair, provided the Board with a report on the 2017-18 football plan with preliminary division assignments. Schools must notify NDHSAA by September 15th for coops and September 30 is the deadline for opting up a division. The committee discussed the playoff structure for all divisions. Motion by Dahlen to approve the football committee report. Second by Schafer. Motion carried unanimously.

Mitch Carlson, Constitution & By-Laws Committee Chair, provided the Board with a committee report on Board regulation regarding preseason participation rules.

Motion by Carlson to strike the following from the pre-season participation rule #2 – Part III, Page 1 of the NDHSAA Board Regulations as follows. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

Pre-season, in season, and post-season participation rules:

- 2) Students may compete only on a school team during the high school season of that sport. ~~Also students may compete as unattached individuals in non-school contests until the first day of classes in their school for the current school year, or first contest, whichever comes first.~~ Violation of the regulation results in loss of eligibility for six contests or remainder of season, whichever is less, for each violation in that sport. The only exception to the above rule is in the case of talented students involved in Olympic competition as explained under Part II, Section III, Article XIV of the By-Laws.

The committee discussed the addition of a definition of “regularly attends” to the interpretations of Section IV of Article XIV - Rules of Eligibility Committee. The committee will continue to discuss this at future meetings.

Awards by-law amendment was discussed with no changes. The amendment will be sent to schools before the next Board meeting with a vote at the General Membership meeting in October.

Motion by Carlson to approve the Constitution & By-Laws Committee report including presentation of the Awards Policy By-Law to the membership with a vote at the October General Membership meeting. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Todd Bertsch, Media Committee Chair provided the Board with a report. The Board received a response from Davis Whitfield from the NFHS Network/HoldCo Board concerning the NDHSAA request of the

NFHS Network/HoldCo Board to honor existing contract amounts for years four and five of the present media rights contract. The HoldCo Board agreed to honor the contracted amounts for NDHSAA.

The radio broadcast fee schedule for baseball and softball regional events was discussed. The committee recommended removing region contests from the baseball and softball radio fee matrix as region baseball and softball tournaments are not managed by NDHSAA, they are considered regular season games.

The committee also recommended removal of the final game only fee from the boys and girls basketball, hockey and volleyball radio fee matrix. All games would be charged at the per game rate.

Motion by Bertsch to approve the Media Committee report. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

Andy Dahlen provided a committee report from the Promotions & Programs Committee regarding NDHSAA logo usage on vendor products. Committee recommended continuation of the current policy to allow the decision to be made by the NDHSAA office staff per request. There was a current request from a vendor to market rings to officials. If the vendor should choose to market rings to officials NDHSAA would receive 15% of the profits.

Motion by Dahlen to approve the Promotions and Programs Committee report. Second by Privratsky. Motion carried unanimously.

Lenny Ohlhauser, Fargo Davies Athletic Director, appeared before the Board to present an appeal of a denied hardship application for a student. Executive Director Fetsch distributed necessary information. Fetsch presented his findings on the hardship investigation. Ohlhauser presented information concerning the appeal to the Board. The Board directed questions to Ohlhauser and the mother of the student. Motion by Schafer to deny the hardship appeal. Second by Privratsky. Roll call vote: Rinas - yes, Dahlen - abstain, Bertsch - yes, Sorlie - yes, Schafer - yes, Manley - yes, Privratsky - yes, Carlson - yes, Baesler - yes, Vollmer – yes. Motion carried 9-0 with 1 abstention.

The Board reviewed a letter from Andy Dahlen, Fargo North Principal, requesting the Board waive Part II, Article XIV, Section II of the NDHSAA Constitution and By-Laws, which limits students to four seasons of one sport during their high school career. Executive Director Fetsch explained the parameters set forth in the Constitution & By-Laws concerning limitations of semesters and seasons. The student was granted two additional semesters of eligibility by Fetsch earlier this summer due to an extreme illness. Dahlen explained the situation of this particular student. The student for whom the waiver was requested presented information to the Board on his condition, the history of his condition and his waiver request. The student provided documents of support from his coach and teachers in support of his request.

Motion by Schafer to approve the waiver. Second by Sorlie. The Board directed questions to the student concerning the timeline of his illness, his participation in sports and his attendance at Fargo North. Roll call vote: Rinas - yes, Dahlen - abstain, Bertsch - yes, Sorlie - yes, Schafer - yes, Manley - yes, Privratsky - yes, Carlson - yes, Vollmer – yes. Motion carried 8-0 with 1 abstention. Motion carried 8-0 with 1 abstention.

The Board considered a request from Mark Rerick, Grand Forks Public Schools Athletic Director, and supporting letters from several other schools requesting the Board study the feasibility of adding clay target as a sanctioned activity. Fetsch distributed the process for adding an activity as approved by the NDHSAA Board of Directors June 22, 2000.

Motion by Vollmer to study the sanctioning of clay target. Second by Privratsky. The Board discussed the approved process of sanctioning an activity.

Withdrawal of motion by Vollmer to study the sanctioning of clay target. Withdrawal of second by Privratsky.

Motion by Vollmer to review the request once a completed proposal has been received. Second by Privratsky. Motion carried unanimously.

Staff member Fletschock reported on the development of a committee to develop baseball pitch count regulation. The NFHS recently passed a regulation requiring each state devise a pitch count regulation before the spring 2017 season. Fletschock provided a list of potential committee members and requested the Board approve a committee. From the list provided by Fletschock, the following committee members were chosen.

Staff member Schell provided an update on the approved NDHSAA strategic plan. The Board discussed the future of the strategic planning process. The Board will discuss the strategic planning process at a later date. The Board expressed appreciation for the work Schell put into the strategic plan update.

1. Rinas brought up discussion on wearing NDHSAA blazers for NDHSAA meetings. Fetsch preferred Board members wearing blazers at all meetings.

Executive Director's Report

1. Fall Administrator Meeting recap was given.
2. New Administrator Orientation recap was provided. Fetsch indicated this was well received by the 13 new administrators in attendance.
3. The 2015-16 apparel report was reviewed.
4. National Guard supporting sponsorship approval was received for the 2016/17 school year.

As per Board regulations, foreign exchange students must be under the auspices of and placed with a U.S. host family by an international exchange program that has been accepted by the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET) and recognized by the US Department of State. The foreign exchange program must assign students to host families by a method that ensures no student, school or other interested party may influence the assignment for athletic or other purposes. The foreign exchange student may not be selected or placed on any basis related to his/her athletic interests or abilities.

Motion by Privratsky to deny request. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeremy Feller, Athletic Director from Our Redeemer’s High School, appeared before the Board to appeal the Executive Board’s recent decision not to allow the late dissolution of a football coop for the 2017 & 2018 football plan. Feller provided letters of support from Lewis & Clark - Berthold and Bishop Ryan. Berthold feels they would better fit into the 9-Man division. Our Redeemer’s feels a coop with Bishop Ryan would be a better fit for travel consideration. Our Redeemer’s and Bishop Ryan have been in a football coop for 17 years. The coop dissolution deadline of June 1st was missed. The Lewis & Clark/Our Redeemer’s coop anticipated 24 students playing this year and ended up with 18. If Our Redeemer’s and Bishop Ryan coop, that would move the Bishop Ryan/Our Redeemer’s coop to Division A and Lewis & Clark - Berthold would move to the 9-Man division. Jon Kohler, Athletic Director from Hettinger High School, appeared to appeal a denied hardship. Necessary information was distributed at the meeting. Fetsch reported the results of the hardship investigation to the Board. The Board questioned the coach, administration and student concerning the hardship. Motion by Bertsch to deny the hardship appeal. Second by Privratsky. Roll call vote: Dahlen - no, Sorlie - no, Schafer - no, Manley- yes, Privratsky - yes, Carlson - yes, Stedman - no, Vollmer - yes, Bertsch - yes (5-4. Motion carried.

Assistant Director Fletschock presented a recommended language change to the Class A Girls Golf team tiebreaker. Recommendation to the tie breaker regulation in case of a tie after 5th and 6th golfer or if no 5th or 6th golfer on either team portion to the State A Girls Golf regulations.

Addition to the team tie breaker regulation:

If still tied, all team members are to play an extra hole, counting four best, and continue in this manner until the tie is broken.

General Assembly Meeting
North Dakota High School Activities Association
October 20, 2016 - Bismarck, ND

The General Assembly of the North Dakota High School Activities Association met at the Bismarck Ramkota on October 20, 2016. President Rinas called the meeting to order at 4:43 p.m.

President Rinas welcomed member schools to the NDHSAA General Assembly. He thanked administrators for what they do for students, schools and communities of North Dakota through their attendance at this meeting and their support of education based activities in our state.

President Rinas declared a quorum and introduced the NDHSAA staff and the NDHSAA Board of Directors and thanked both for all they do for member schools.

The minutes of the October 2015 General Assembly Meeting were addressed. Motion by Jason Wiberg, Devils Lake Public Schools to approve the minutes. Second by Jim Roaldson, Jamestown Public Schools. Motion carried.

The minutes of the January 2016 Membership Meeting were addressed. Motion by Brandt Dick, Underwood Public Schools to approve the minutes. Second by Dave Zittleman, Bismarck Public Schools. Motion carried.

Rinas introduced Mya Steinwehr, 2016/17 NDHSAA/Farmers Union Insurance Distinguished Student from Hankinson High School, to address the membership. Steinwehr discussed the Distinguished Student program and emphasized the honor of being chosen as the Distinguished Student. Steinwehr indicated the distinguished students are not necessarily the leader on the basketball team, they are the backbone of interscholastic activities. They are the individuals whose participation in high school activities strengthens programs for participants, schools and communities. She stressed the importance of getting involved in athletics and activities. Sports and activities teach leadership responsibility and sportsmanship. Nothing can teach the importance of hard work like sports. Athletics are not always rewarding and gratifying they also teach participants how to deal with failure. She has learned to be positive in defeat and humble in victory. Through speech she has gained confidence through continual practice, music has brought her joy, and the science fair, which demands the most dedication, has brought her confidence and creativity. Steinwehr added sports and activities should never get in the way of academics. Teachers should not be tolerant of missed deadlines or missed assignment. Academic expectations should be the same for students whether or not they are involved in activities. Steinwehr seeks to inspire and motivate those around her. This would not have been possible without teachers, coaches and team mates. The people we should most appreciate are those who put forth the most effort. In closing, Steinwehr stated success is not determined by the scoreboard or the award, it is determined by the way others look at you.

Steinwehr thanked the membership for providing the Distinguished Student program and establishing this award.

President Rinas introduced Matt Fetsch, NDHSAA Executive Director. Fetsch gave the membership background information on the proposed Awards By-Law amendment and how the amendment was developed.

Motion by Guy Fridley, Dickinson Public Schools to propose the following amendment to the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Law. Second by Jason Wiberg, Devils Lake Public Schools.

Part II, Article IX: Awards

~~SECTION I: The giving and receiving of awards and medals shall:~~

- ~~a. Be kept within reasonable bounds~~
- ~~b. Have symbolic value only, and~~
- ~~c. Be done by and with the consent and under the supervision of the superintendent and/or principal concerned.~~

SECTION I: A student activities participant may not accept monetary compensation in recognition of activities ability, participation and/or achievement.

~~SECTION II: Awards such as unattached letter, trophy, metal football, metal basketball, metal track shoe or similar article of symbolic value only may be given, provided that the cost of the awards shall not exceed the amount set by the NDHSAA Board of Directors (\$300.00).~~

SECTION II: A student may accept non-monetary compensation or items of value solely in recognition of activities ability, participation and/or achievement if the total monetary compensation or items of value, including the actual value of any gift certificates (so long as they are not convertible to cash), discounts, coupons, etc., does not exceed the amount set by the NDHSAA Board of Directors during the Association year (July 1-June 30).

~~SECTION III: Conferences or schools conducting invitational tourneys and meets under Association rules may make awards to the winning schools or contestants, provided that the awards are within the bounds of Sections I and II.~~

SECTION III: Non-monetary compensation or items of value does not include customary awards of symbolic nature without resale value such as the school's athletic letter, medals, ribbons, certificates, plaques, trophies and other emblems, provided the cost of the award does not exceed the amount set by the NDHSAA Board of Directors.

NOTE: This rule does not regulate or prohibit compensation received by a student for ability, participation and/or achievement in a non-NDHSAA sponsored sport or activity, nor does this rule prohibit the acceptance of college scholarships by students.

~~SECTION IV: Suitable awards of symbolic value only may be given by such organizations as service clubs, patriot organizations, civic groups, Dads' and Mothers' Club, and the sports department of a newspaper, radio or television station. No awards shall be accepted which in any way advertises any firm or individual so far as commercial or business interests are concerned "with the exception of NDHSAA approved corporate sponsors for NDHSAA awards".~~

SECTION IV: A coach or director is responsible for reporting to the school's athletic/activities director all compensation or items of value received by the students on that coach/director's team within one month of the receipt of the compensation or items of value. School administration is responsible for verifying that the total sum of compensation or items of value received by each student participant at that school does not exceed the retail value amount set in Section II.

~~SECTION VI:~~ **SECTION V: The Board shall have authority to designate, give and control medals and trophies to be awarded to schools or individuals on championship teams in any sport or activity, provided that these awards are kept within the bounds of Sections I and II III.**

~~SECTION VI: Awards, medals, recognitions, gifts, trips and honors shall not be accepted by individuals or schools from colleges, universities and higher institutions of learning and their alumni. High school athletes or performers should be permitted to complete their high school careers without being exploited by outside sources.~~

SECTION VII: SECTION VI: Penalties for violations of the above rules may be suspension of the school and ineligibility of the individual who accepts the award.

A roll call vote of the membership was taken. Amendment passed. (Yes - 106 No – 6) and will go into effect July 1, 2017.

Board member Andy Dahlen, Football Committee Chair, introduced the football committee and presented the final 2017 and 2018 football plan to the assembly. Football divisions have been set with 14 teams in Division AAA, 10 in Division AA, 32 teams in Division A, remaining in the 9-Man division. Regions were presented to the membership. Dahlen described the process and the survey results concerning the number of 9-Man regions Athletic Directors would like to see in the 2017 and 2018 football plan. The 2017 and 2018 plan includes six regions in the 9-Man division. Dahlen thanked the NDHSAA staff and the football committee for their work on the football plan over the past year.

The Executive Director gave his report:

- Explained the process of NDOA recommendations to the Board. Those recommendations will be acted upon at the December 2016 Board meeting. NDOA recommends a 5% increase locked in for two years.
- NFHS developed new baseball regulations concerning pitching limitations. The new regulations limit not only the innings a pitcher can pitch, but also the number of pitches that may be thrown. Committee members met today and will be looking for feedback on recommendations to bring to the Board in December.
- In reference to the 1999 Prince song, “Party Like it’s 1999”, Fetach reflected on what NDHSAA sports and activities looked like in 1999.
 - Thinking back to 17 years ago, high school sports have changed tremendously. The biggest change is how high school programs now more closely match what college teams looked like in 1999.
 - The By-Law amendment that just passed looks more closely like college NCAA regulations in 1999.
 - Media coverage has changed dramatically with the addition of social media. Television contracts now dictate much of our scheduling for post season. We are likely not too far from TV also dictating not only state tournaments, but also region contests.
 - Flashing back, sport specialization had just taken off in 1999 and at that time, athletes were specializing for college scholarship consideration. Today we are seeing specialization in larger schools, not geared toward college scholarships but geared toward making the high school team.

- The NFHS recently came out with a “My Reason Why” campaign. This has been introduced through various media platforms with the goal to highlight the value and benefit of participating in high school sports and activities. Tom Mix in the NDHSAA office is heading up this campaign. Fetsch noted that it did not take Tom very long after starting at the NDHSAA to develop his “Why”.
 - The NDHSAA “Why” includes that our state is fortunate to have low membership fees to our member schools. Ticket prices are kept low. NDHSAA provides catastrophic insurance to member schools and at the forefront, the fact that participation not only develops self and community but the effects are immediate and for the rest of their lives.
 - Fetsch received a parent phone call a couple weeks ago questioning how his child could transfer out of state to a sport academy and remain eligible in his home school on his return. His child did not want to go. He wanted to stay in his home school and play with his friends. The parent wanted to know how to change the NDHSAA By-Law. The student had it figured out...he knew his reason “Why”.
- In closing, Fetsch brought back some of former Executive Director Sherm Sylling’s cowboy logic.
 - “Good judgment comes from experience and a lot of that experience comes from bad judgment.”

Board Correspondence

1. St. Joseph Catholic School (grades 7-8) in Moorhead, has a cooperative sponsorship with Shanley High School in Fargo. The Minnesota High School League does not oversee grades 7-8, only grades 9-12. Some grade 7-8 St. Joseph students were participating in the Shanley High School coop and also competing on middle school teams in Minnesota. When this came to light last year, Shanley High School cleaned up coops with St. Joseph and assured all students coming from St. Joseph's were participating only for Shanley High School. A parent called the NDHSAA office and Constitution & By-Laws committee members requesting a change in the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws to allow St. Joseph students to compete on North Dakota and Minnesota teams. Shanley has indicated they will self-report this issue in the near future.

Representative Reports

- Privratsky would like to have a review of the cooperative sponsorship process on a future agenda to see if any improvements can be made. The guidelines currently specify to Class B schools if they coop with another school and their combined enrollment is over 325, they must compete as a Class A school with exceptions for wrestling, cross country and softball. The same limitations are not put on Class A coops.
- Bertsch would like to place the hardship process on a future agenda to see if there are any changes that should be made. It would also be beneficial to find out what other states are doing in the area of hardships.
- Baesler updated the Board on what is happening at the State Capitol in the transition process after the general election. The legislators will be in Bismarck on Monday and Tuesday next week and there were many changes to the makeup of the legislative body. The legalization of medical marijuana is an issue our schools may need to deal with.
- Vollmer would like to discuss fan behavior at tournaments. He is frustrated that school administrators are not present to address student fan issues and questioned if we need to provide direction to our schools on expectations of administrators at tournaments. Fetsch indicated there is an NDHSAA By-Law requiring a faculty representative to be present. Vollmer feels this reflects poorly on our state especially when tournaments are broadcast or streamed.

Executive Director's Report

- a. Fetsch provided preliminary fall tournament financials to the Board.
 - b. Fetsch indicated he received a complaint from Bismarck Legacy High School concerning behavior of a Shanley fan at state volleyball. Legacy High School and Shanley administrators have been in conversation and through investigations the issue is being resolved between the schools.
 - c. NDHSAA received several inquiries this week concerning waiver of the nine practice rule due to weather issues. Fetsch reported the answer the schools have been given is the rule exists for the safety of athletes and would not be waived unless the Board brings it forward.

St. Joseph's was allowing students to participate in two different cooperative sponsorships in the same sport. Some students participated at Shanley and other students at Horizon Middle School in Moorhead in girls basketball. NDHSAA By-Laws allows cooperative sponsorships with only one school per sport. The situation has been rectified by Shanley High School and St. Joseph's Middle School. A letter of reprimand and a \$500 fine were administered. Any further violations may result in the immediate dissolution of all Shanley and St. Joseph's coops.

- Grand Forks Public Schools reported a jr. high home school student participated for their schools while attending school in East Grand Forks. When this was discovered by Grand Forks Public Schools participation ended immediately. Letter of reprimand was issued.
- Beulah High School reported a girls basketball player exceeded the nightly quarter participation limit. Prescribed penalty was administered with a letter of reprimand and forfeiture of games in which the ineligible student participated
- Solen High School reported a violation of the 9 practice rule. Prescribed penalty administered with letter of reprimand and forfeiture of all games in which the ineligible student participated.

The Board reviewed the existing cooperative sponsorship (coop) By-Law, guidelines and naming recommendations. The philosophy of cooperative sponsorships was discussed including the size and length of coop agreements. Members indicated reasons for schools to form coops vary from school to school. Offering a sport via a coop often allows students to participate in a sport that would not be possible for them to participate in without a coop. Some coops are formed to become competitive, some coops are formed to allow participation. The Board is cautious to implement regulations that limit participation. The coop forms were discussed. The addition of the status of students cut from program as a question on the form was also discussed. The addition of the question “Have you cut students from your program?” may be something to add.

The Board reviewed the current Hardship Eligibility Procedure. The Board discussed what, if anything should be added to the procedure to assist in making hardship determinations. Addition of the question “Was the transfer athletically motivated?” was discussed.

North Dakota High School Activities Association
February 3, 2017, Valley City, ND

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held a special board meeting on February 3, 2017 in Valley City. President Rinas called the meeting to order at 3:00 pm.

Members present: Schafer, Sorlie, Rinas, Dahlen, Privratsky, Stedman, Bertsch, Manley

Members absent: Vollmer, Baesler, Carlson

The special meeting was requested by President Rinas in order to discuss legislative activities. The following bills and resolutions were discussed:

- House Bill 1275 concerning prayer at public events was heard in Judiciary Committee on January 25. Fetsch testified on the current protocol used when following Federal law. This bill will be heard on the house floor in the near future. If a vote comes up, Fetsch will notify Board members.
- House Committee Resolution 3012, a recommendation for NDHSAA to sponsor three divisions of girls and boys basketball and to sponsor 6-man football was discussed. Schafer indicated he had visited with legislative members in his area who sponsored the bill to make them aware of the process used by NDHSAA to determine divisions. Privratsky indicated his legislators did not feel this resolution was needed. The resolution is scheduled for a hearing on Tuesday, February 7, 2017. The Board provided Fetsch direction, if asked, to inform the committee about the NDHSAA member driven organization and the process used to determine divisions. Fetsch indicated he compiled all pertinent information needed such as a timeline as to when these topics were last addressed, the meetings held in all regions of the state, the member surveys, the member straw vote and the most recent amendments concerning classification indicating the majority of NDHSAA member schools are not interested in a 3 class system.
- Senate Bill 2249 is a bill to prohibit some convicted felons and individuals with specific restraining orders issued against them from participating in NDHSAA sports and activities. The bill will be heard by the Senate committee on Monday, February 6, 2017 at 11:00 am. Fetsch asked the Board if there was a need for NDHSAA to testify. Baesler indicated the best approach would be to come and be available to answer questions. She also indicated the same players heavily involved in Marcy's law are also involved in this case. More work will undoubtedly be done in committee. Rinas indicated the difficulty in this bill lies with schools being notified of students being involved in a court process. Whether we take a position or not, this needs to be clarified concerning notification. Privratsky is of the opinion the NDHSAA can support this bill through "Convicted of a AA Felony". The difficult portion of this bill would be the restraining order portion. Testimony would have to show the difficulty schools would have in enforcement. Privratsky also felt it would be advantageous to have our legal counsel present to explain the difficulties schools would have with enforcement. Fetsch indicated our legal counsel will not be able to attend as she has a meeting/hearing at the same time as the committee meeting. Fetsch indicated an issue with this bill is that the North Dakota High School Activities Association is

specifically named. NDHSAA sponsors 22 activities, however, there are several activities that are not sponsored, such as DECA, FFA, FCA, Robotics and FBLA. Removing the NDHSAA from this bill would cover all activities, not just NDHSAA activities. Manley asked if NDHSAA had heard from the School Boards Association concerning this. Fetsch indicated there had been no communication with the School Boards Association to this point. Fetsch stated he will be present and available for questions at the committee meeting on February 6th. Fetsch stated he didn't feel there were any issues with the idea or the intent of the bill. His concerns include mandatory reporting of juveniles and school sponsored activities not sponsored by NDHSAA. The Board consensus was in agreement with the above statement.

Next Board meeting is scheduled for March 17, 2017 in Minot.

The Board of Directors of the North Dakota High School Activities Association held a special board meeting on March 7, 2017 in Valley City. President Rinas called the meeting to order at 12:45 pm.

The special meeting was requested by President Rinas in order to discuss legislative activities. The following bills and resolutions were discussed:

- Senate Bill 2249 is a bill to prohibit some convicted felons and individuals with specific restraining orders issued against them from participating in NDHSAA sports and activities. Fetsch indicated an updated bill was published by the ND Legislature and passed on to the Board. There was a House Committee meeting held March 1. Fetsch will notify Board members when the bill comes to a vote in the House. Manley visited with legislators concerning this bill. His legislator indicated there has been work on changing the language on this bill. Fetsch indicated the remaining questions on the bill pertain to clarification on the restraining orders listed.
- House Committee Resolution 3012, a recommendation for NDHSAA to sponsor three divisions of girls and boys basketball and to sponsor 6-man football was defeated in the House.
- House Bill 1275 concerning prayer at public events was discussed. There is a committee hearing tentatively set for March 22. As it is written, it does not change existing procedures in NDHSAA activities. The bill does not include any reference to using a PA system for prayer. The language uses the term "delivery" but does not specify whether that would include using the PA system.

Fetsch notified the Board of the postponement of Region 4, 6 and 8 Boys Basketball tournaments due to weather in the northern and north central portion of the state. All three tournaments are now scheduled for Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 9, 10, and 11. Postponing these tournaments did not take Board action as the Board has previously granted the NDHSAA office permission to move these tournaments as needed. Fetsch requested discussion by the Board of options for the completion of these tournaments if there were additional weather issues. Consensus of the Board was to move completion of the tournament to Sunday afternoon if additional weather issues are encountered.

Next Board meeting is scheduled for March 17, 2017 in Minot.

**District Chairperson Notes
Minot - Holiday Inn (Riverside)
March 17, 2017**

The Class B District Chair meeting was held on March 17, 2017 at the Minot Holiday Inn - Riverside. Chairman Manley called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with 16 districts represented. Upon introductions, Chairman Manley welcomed the district chairpersons and thanked them for representing their district.

The Executive Director thanked the member schools for past service as district chairs. Sheets were distributed requesting information on the 2018 basketball district chairperson and each district's recommendation for district and region sites, dates and managers. Fetsch informed the chairs of the approval process and timeline for approving district and region sites. Fetsch also explained only district chair recommendations approved by Athletic Review will continue to the NDHSAA Board for review.

Each district was given the opportunity to present their district's recommendations, which are listed as submitted.

District 16-----Kent Harding, AD Divide County HS
No items

District 15-----Randy Cranston, AD Watford City HS
3 class system

Cranston indicated a similar recommendation was passed in 2015/16 by District Chairs with a vote of 14-2. Vote failed at the Board level. His district would like NDHSAA to form a committee to create and propose a plan for a 3 class system in basketball and volleyball. Their district indicated they were in favor of 16 teams in the highest class with no opinion on the makeup of the other two classes. Fetsch indicated the proposal from 2015/16 was very different from the proposal this year. The 2015/16 proposal was for basketball only and requested implementation by 2017-18. There was discussion on changing the enrollment number to which Fetsch reminded chairs of the NDHSAA bylaw stating if there are 2 divisions in any sport or activity, enrollments of 325 and higher are Class A and all others are Class B. Cranston informed the group the main objective of this request would be to form a committee to create a plan for a 3 class system in volleyball and basketball. Currently team alignments are recommended by the Realignment Committee. Fetsch provided some history to the group including in 2009 the Board created a plan and presented it around the state. A straw poll vote indicated member schools overwhelmingly rejected the plan. There was another straw poll vote in October 2010 in which member school also overwhelmingly rejected the suggestion of a 3 class system. A vote was requested. VOTE: 11-5

Number of participants per school per event at region track

Cranston explained the proposal as such: If athletes qualify by time, they qualify for the state tournament however with this proposal, a coach could put 5 additional athletes in the region tournament above and beyond those already qualified. Would like to allow kids who qualify by time then add 5 more participants. Proposal was referred to track advisory. No Vote requested.

AA football Region

Cranston indicated displeasure with the AA football region. The AA football region contains 10 teams in one region. Fetsch explained NDHSAA survey results indicated that was the

preference of AA football schools. Cranston feels 10 teams is too small for any division and would like to have at least 16 teams in a division in any sport. No vote.

Mercy Rule regulation-situations

There was discussion concerning when the clock should stop when the mercy rule is in effect. Cranston feels the clock should stop at free throws, time outs, injuries, and substitutions. Main request would be to stop at free throws. Clock already stops at time outs and injuries. Discussion involved moving the point differential where the mercy rule goes into effect. Point difference was discussed and decided differential was adequate. Coaches should use better discretion in subbing. Districts were surveyed to see if any district was entirely opposed to the mercy rule and there was not an overwhelming response. Final request was to vote on an addition to mercy rule to stop the clock at free throws. VOTE: 15-1

Spectator removal protocol

Cranston would like to see implementation of a statewide protocol which everyone follows. Should there be a list of items that are automatic ejections? There are situations that would be nice to have some guidance. Region 1 has the yellow card policy. There are flyers posted reminding people of behavior guidelines. The flyers help remind people to use good sportsmanship. The district has yellow cards given to fans by administrators if they are using inappropriate behavior. The yellow card indicates "Please remember to use good sportsmanship". Overall recommendation is each district create their own process. District 1 offered to share their policy with other schools in the state.

District 13-----Daryl Jung, AD New England HS and District 14-----Randy Johnson, AD Hazen HS

*No Class B State Basketball Tournaments (Girls or Boys) in Grand Forks

Randy Johnson indicated their district would like a straw vote on this. Grand Forks as a community was not welcoming and their district would like the tournaments more centrally located. Fetsch informed the group of the current rotation in place. With this rotation no community will have more than 2 winter tournaments in any year. There are many circumstances to take into consideration such as: other NDHSAA tournaments, overlap of Class A region tournaments with Class B girls state tournament and UND hockey schedule to name a few. Johnson said his district did not want to make this a regulation. Issues will be discussed at the Combined Tournament Committee meeting. VOTE: 5-11

*Three Class System for basketball and volleyball - Ask the NDHSAA board to look at creating a three class system for basketball and volleyball

*Mercy Rule – Have the clock shut off for free throws.

Previously discussed.

*Allow Boys and Girls Basketball players to play 7 quarters per night

Daryl Jung pointed out small schools that have to use players for multiple games struggle to have players have enough quarters to use. Their district plays many South Dakota teams and South Dakota currently uses a 7 quarter rule. In opposition, some schools may be up 30 points in sub-varsity games and the winning team does not put in some players. Jung indicated this would be more for teams that can't put full squads together. Others thought it tough to put in a rule for just those games. Some coaches will abuse this and play their top kids for 7 quarters. Some discussion involved implementing this at lower levels but not at the varsity level. Propose allowing boys and girls basketball players to play 7 quarters per night. VOTE: 9-6

District 12-----Larry Derr, Principal/AD Glenburn HS

*3 man crew fee for basketball

District 12 would like to have a set fee for 3 man crews rather than paying per official. Other districts did not feel officials would not like this but at some time there has to be a freeze on what they are being paid. Fletschock reminded chairs we are trying to grow our pool of officials. Implementing a lower pay rate will not be beneficial for growing officials. He also reminded the group this is a maximum, not a minimum. VOTE: 1-15

*Girls golf to the fall.

Discussion included how moving girls golf to the fall would affect participation. VOTE: 5-11
Mercy Rule. Our district would like to see this rule go away however we would be in favor of stopping the clock during free throws in the 4th quarter.

Previously discussed.

Discussion of bonus free throw at 5 fouls and double bonus at 7 fouls with them re-setting each quarter. This is being discussed at the NFHS level.

No vote requested.

District 11-----Malcolm Marcus, AD TGU Towner HS

*Girls/Boys Basketball: Mercy rule: Implement at 45 points instead of 30 points.

Previously discussed.

District 10-----Vicki Bender, AD Wilton HS

We recommend State Volleyball be in Minot every year going forth. It doesn't require a vote, just our recommendation.

*Penalty wording for playing too many quarters/matches: "forfeit that game/match/meet.

Change the penalty wording to "Primary coach would be disqualified for next game/match/meet at that level." This was proposed by District Chairs in 2015-16, however there was not a consequence listed. Bender indicated they are now recommending to remove the current player penalty involving quarter/inning/game limits and create the penalty that the primary coach in which the quarter violation occurred would be disqualified for the next game/match/meet at that level. VOTE: 13-3

Pairing regions for all future football plans with region scheduling partners for non-region games set by the state at all levels.

Discussion included this would eliminate some non-region rivalries. Would also have the potential to increase travel for some teams. This will be discussed during the creation of the next football plan.

District 9-----Steve Folmer, AD Solen HS

District 8-----Brad Fitzgerald, AD St. John HS

Allow junior high students to make up for more than 50% of an ensemble.

Bubach suggested this be remanded to music advisory. There is a rule in place indicating 7th and 8th graders can not make up more than 50% of an ensemble. There are two reasons: 1) NDHSAA does not sponsor varsity sub-level contests. 2) NDHSAA does not allow Jr. High teams to compete against high school teams. Entries go forward on a percentage of participants. In 2015 there were 1,608 competitors with 808 entries at the State Class B Music Contest. Ask this be forwarded to music advisory. Vote to refer to music advisory. VOTE: 16-0

District 7-----Scott Lindgren, Leeds HS

*Mercy Rule – Would like to see changes

Officials are to stop the clock on all 4th quarter free throws.

Officials are to stop the clock on all 4th quarter substitutions, until play is ready to be resumed, then officials can signal the time keeper to start the clock.

- South Prairie High School reported a boys basketball player exceeded the nightly quarter participation limit. Prescribed penalty was administered with a letter of reprimand and forfeiture of games in which the ineligible student participated
- Hettinger High School eligibility issue. A junior high student from Lemmon, SD wrestled for Hettinger High School in several tournaments without the benefit of a co-op agreement. The ineligible wrestler was reported by Lemmon AD. There is a history of students participating for Hettinger who are not eligible to do so for various reasons, usually related to home school designation. Penalty is a \$1000 fine and 2 years probation beginning with 2017-18 year. Hettinger High School must submit an action plan to address participation violations, particularly related to home-school students.
- Jamestown High School self-reported an athlete participated in a contest immediately following an ejection. Student was held out of the next competition. A letter of reprimand was issued, forfeiture of points earned, and Jamestown High School must submit an action plan for educating coaches on NDHSAA By-Laws and rules by 4/27/17.
- Napoleon High School self-reported a group conducted a fundraiser during a post-season tournament. No penalty, the money raised was deposited with the concessions revenue.

March 16, 2017

- Mandaree High School appealed the Executive Director's determination stating Mandaree violated the Constitution and By-Laws, Part Two, Article VI, Sections IX and X. The Executive Committee upheld the Executive Director's determination, and will meet to determine the penalty.

Motion by Dahlen to approve the Executive Committee report. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

Part II Article XIV, Section IV: Questions and Answers were presented as follows and discussed.

PART II, ARTICLE XIV, SECTION IV:

SECTION IV: Students must be making satisfactory progress toward the school's requirements for graduation. The school where the student is fully enrolled and regularly attends shall determine satisfactory progress. Failure to acquire two and one half credits at the end of a semester will make him/her ineligible for a minimum of two weeks the following semester.

Q. What is meant by regularly attends?

A. Regularly attends is the minimum number of classes required by the local school district.

Q. What if a student maintains a full class load entirely online?

A. A student who maintains a full online class load is ineligible to compete for any NDHSAA member school. During the current semester a student who takes online courses must also physically attend at least one (1) class at his/her NDHSAA member school of attendance in order to be eligible to participate. A student who transitions from an entirely online class load to physical attendance is subject to NDHSAA transfer rules.

Motion by Carlson to approve Part II Article XIV, Section IV: Questions and Answers. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

The committee introduced the following amendment to Part II, Article V of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Laws offering an electronic ballot for the Board member elections for discussion. No action was taken. This will be reviewed at the May meeting.

Carolyn Bluestone, Mandaree High School Superintendent, appeared before the Board to appeal the penalty set by the Executive Board for violation of Part II, Article III, Section VII of the NDHSAA Constitution related to sportsmanship at Association contests. NDHSAA received a report from an

officials association leader citing concerns with fan behavior toward officials from two contests held in Mandaree. The Executive Board determined violations occurred and determined consequences for the violations. According to the sportsmanship By-Law, Mandaree has the right to appeal the Executive Board's decision within 30 days. Mandaree exercised their right to appeal to the Executive Board. Bluestone introduced other individuals from Mandaree in attendance. Bluestone provided Mandaree's sportsmanship action plan that will be presented to the Mandaree School Board over the summer. Bluestone requested reconsideration of the length of probation for Mandaree.

Vollmer suggested Mandaree may request to appear before the Board in May of 2018 to review the implementation of the action plan. Dahlen indicated he favored maintaining the penalty as is. Sorlie stated from reviewing the information provided, the coaches are creating sportsmanship issues. Coaches attitudes are reflected in players. Sorlie questioned if there was a plan for the coaches. Ann Longie, Mandaree's incoming superintendent, stated the policies are already in place. She plans to use their policy approved in 9/22/14 as an educational piece for coaches. She intends to be present at all coach and parent meetings. The current Mandaree policy includes consequences and she will provide follow-through. Sorlie asked Mike Jensen, Mandaree Athletic Director, if he believes fan behavior was an issue all year or if there were just these two instances. Jensen indicated there were sportsmanship issues throughout the year. Rinas indicated tabling the issue for a year puts the responsibility on a future Board to make a decision. Motion was rescinded by Vollmer.

Privratsky moved to deny the appeal. Second by Sorlie. Roll call vote: Manley-yes, Vollmer-no, Carlson-yes, Bertsch-yes, Sorlie-yes, Privratsky-yes, Dahlen-yes, Stedman-no, Rinas-yes. Motion carried. (7-2)

Todd Bertsch, Media Committee Chair, provided a committee report concerning the following:

Mark Vollmer, Fine Arts Committee Chair, provided the Board with the committee report. The committee discussed the following with no Board action required at this time.

Any current transfer students that attend Sawyer High School will not be varsity eligible at their new school of attendance until their one (1) year waiting period is complete. The immediate eligibility provision applies only to the beginning of the 2017-18 school year. Following the start of the school year, any students that transfer to a different school will be subject to NDHSAA transfer rules. Students that make a lock, stock and barrel move into the Sawyer School District following the end of the 2016-17 academic year will only be immediately eligible at Max Public School, unless they meet some other exception for immediate eligibility.

Motion by Vollmer to approve Sawyer Public School's request for immediate eligibility of all students in grades 7-12 for the 2017-18 school year in the school of their choosing as per the request stated above. Second by Dahlen. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a request from Jennifer Fremstad, North Dakota Association of Secondary School Principals (NDASSP) President requesting recognition of the three winning schools of the North Dakota State Acalympic Competition during the NDHSAA sponsored state basketball tournaments made in conjunction with current Academic All State awards ceremony at the ND state basketball tournaments. Fetsch indicated the Academic All State winners currently receive one student ticket and two adult tickets. Bertsch recommended the responsibility for additional guests back to the NDASSP. Motion by Bertsch to approve the recognition of the ND State Acalympic winners with students receiving a free ticket to the event. Second by Vollmer. Motion carried unanimously.

The NDHSAA seven-year calendar was reviewed including proposed dates through 2023-24. Motion by Vollmer to approve the proposed dates for 2023-24. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Fetsch requested a change of date for the NDHSAA Board of Directors March meeting from March 16, 2018 in Bismarck to March 22, 2018 in Valley City. Motion by Privratsky to approve a change of date for the NDHSAA Board of Directors meeting on March 16, 2018 in Bismarck to March 22, 2018 in Valley City. Second by Manley. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Stedman to approve waiver of Section I, Article XIV regarding student attendance. Second by Sorlie. Motion carried unanimously.

Report on Financial Statements

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
JUNE 30, 2017**

1. DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

The North Dakota High School Activities Association is a nonprofit corporation established for the purpose of providing service for all local school districts in North Dakota. The major funding sources for the Association are membership dues, sponsorships, and sales and charges at athletic events.

General and administrative activities include the functions necessary to provide support the Association's program activities. General and administrative activities include those that provide governance (Board of Directors), oversight, business management, financial recordkeeping, budgeting, legal services, human resource management, and similar activities that ensure an adequate working environment and an equitable employment program.

Fundraising activities include publicizing and conducting fundraising campaigns, maintaining donor lists, conducting special fundraising events; and other activities involved with soliciting contributions from corporations, foundations, individuals and others.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Association maintains its records on the modified cash basis of accounting. Under this method of accounting, revenues and related assets are recorded when received rather than when earned or receivable, and expenses are recorded when the obligation is paid. This differs from generally accepted accounting principles in that revenues are to be recorded when earned rather than when received and expenses recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. On an ongoing basis, the Association's management evaluates the estimates and assumptions based upon historical experience and various other factors and circumstances; however, the actual results could differ from those estimates.

NET ASSETS

The financial statements report net assets and changes in net assets in three classes that are based upon the existence or absence of restrictions on use that are placed by its donors as follows:

UNRESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Unrestricted net assets are resources available to support operations. The only limits on the use of unrestricted net assets are the broad limits resulting for the nature of the organization, the environment in which it operates, the purposes specified in corporate documents and its application for tax-exempt status, and any limits resulting from contractual agreements with creditors and others that are entered into in the course of its operations.

TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Temporarily restricted net assets are resources that are restricted by a donor for use for a particular purpose or in a particular future period. The Association's unspent contributions are classified in this class if the donor limited their use, as are unspent appreciation of its donor restricted endowment funds.

When a donor's restriction is satisfied, either by using the resources in the manner specified by the donor or by the passage of time, the expiration of the restriction is reported in the financial statements by reclassifying the net assets from temporarily restricted to unrestricted net assets. Net assets restricted for

acquisition of buildings or equipment are reported as temporarily restricted until the specified asset is placed in service by the Association, unless the donor provides more specific directions about the period of its use.

PERMANENTLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Permanently restricted net assets are resources whose use by the Association is limited by donor-imposed restrictions that neither expire by being used in accordance with a donor=s restriction nor by the passage of time. The portion of the Association=s donor restricted endowment funds that must be maintained in perpetuity are classified in this net asset class.

All revenues and net gains are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets in the statement of activities unless the use of the related resources is subject to temporary or permanent donor restrictions. All expenses and net losses other than losses on endowment investments are reported as decreases in unrestricted net assets. Net losses on endowment investments reduce temporarily restricted net assets to the extent that net gains of the fund from prior years are unspent and classified there; remaining losses are classified in decreases in unrestricted net assets. If an endowment fund has no net gains from prior years, such as when a fund is newly established, net losses are classified as decreases in unrestricted net assets.

CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash equivalents are short term interest bearing highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, unless the investments are held for meeting restrictions of a capital or endowment nature.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable are primarily unsecured non-interest bearing amounts due from grantors on cost reimbursement or performance grants. Management believes that all outstanding accounts receivable are collectible in full, therefore no allowance for uncollected receivables has been provided.

SHORT TERM INVESTMENTS

The Association invests cash in excess of its immediate needs in money market funds. Short term investments are reported at fair value.

The investment policy specific to these investments is monitored by the Finance Committee.

INVENTORIES

Inventories of food are stated at the lower of cost or market using the first-in, first-out method

CONTRIBUTIONS RECEIVABLE

Contributions receivable are unconditional promises to give that are recognized as contributions when the promise is received. Contributions receivable that are expected to be collected in less than one year are reported at net realizable value. Contribution receivables that are expected to be collected in more than one year are recorded at fair value at the date of promise. That fair value is computed using a present value technique applied to anticipated cash flows. Amortization of the resulting discount is recognized as

additional contribution revenue. The allowance for uncollectible contributions receivable is determined based on management's evaluation of the collectibility of individual promises. Promises that remain uncollected more than one year after their due dates are written off unless the donors indicate the payment is merely postponed.

LAND BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Land, buildings and equipment are reported in the balance sheet at cost, if purchased, and at fair value at the date of donation, if donated. All land and buildings are capitalized. Equipment is capitalized if it has a cost of \$1,000 or more and a useful life when acquired of more than one year. Repairs and maintenance that do not significantly increase the useful life of the assets are expensed as incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the asset as follows:

Buildings and improvements	40 years
Leasehold improvements	5-20 years
Equipment	3-15 years

ACCOUNTING FOR CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recognized when received. All contributions are recorded as increases in unrestricted net assets unless use of contributed assets is specifically restricted by donor. Amounts received that are restricted by the donor to use in future periods or for specific purposes are reported as increases in either temporarily restricted or permanently restricted net assets, consistent with the nature of the restrictions. Unconditional promises with payments due in future years have an implied restriction to be used in the year the payment is due, and therefore are reported as temporarily restricted until the payment is due unless the contribution is clearly intended to support activities of the current fiscal year or is received with permanent restrictions. Conditional promises, such as matching grants, are not recognized until they become unconditional, that is, until all conditions on which they depend are substantially met.

GIFTS-IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

The Association periodically receives contributions in a form other than cash and investments. If the Association receives a contribution of land, buildings, or equipment the contributed asset is recognized as an asset at its estimated fair value at the date of the gift, provided that the value of the asset and its estimated useful life meets the Association's capitalization policy. Donated use of facilities is reported as contribution and expense at the estimated fair value of for rent under similar circumstances. Donated supplies are recorded as contributions at the date of the gift and as expenses when the donated items are placed into service or distributed.

The Association benefits from personal services provided by a substantial amount of volunteers. Those volunteers have donated significant amounts of time and services in the Association's program operations. However, the majority of the contributed services do not meet the criteria for recognition in the financial statements. GAAP allow the recognition of contributed services only if (a) the services create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b) the services would have been purchased if not provided by the contribution, require specialized skills, and are provided by individuals possessing those skills.

GRANT REVENUE

Grant revenue is recognized when the qualifying costs are incurred for cost reimbursement grants or contracts or when a unit of service is provided for performance grants. Grant revenue from Federal agencies is subject to independent audit under the Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133 and

review by grantor agencies. The review could result in the disallowance of expenditures under the terms of the grant or reductions of future grant funds. Based on prior experience, the Association's management believes that any costs disallowed would not materially affect the financial position of the Association.

EXPENSE RECOGNITION AND ALLOCATION

The cost of providing the Association's programs and other activities is summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities and statement of functional activities. Expenses that can be identified with a specific program or support service are charged directly to that program or support service. Costs common to multiple functions have been allocated among the various functions benefitted.

General and administrative expenses include those costs that are not directly identifiable with any specific program, but which provide for overall support and direction of the Association.

Fundraising costs are expensed as incurred, even though they may result in contributions received in future years. The Association generally does not conduct its fundraising activities in conjunction with its other activities. In the few cases in which it does, joint costs have been allocated between fundraising and management and general expenses in accordance with standards for accounting for cost of activities that include fundraising. Additionally, advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

TAX STATUS

The Association is incorporated exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), though it would be subject to tax on income unrelated to its exempt purposes (unless otherwise exempted by the IRC). The tax years of 2017, 2016, and 2014 are still open to audit for federal purposes. Contributions to the Association are tax deductible to donors under Section 170 of the IRC. The Association is not classified as a private foundation.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Association reports its fair value measures using a three-level hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. This hierarchy, established by GAAP, requires that entities maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value are as follows:

Level 1. Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets to which the Association has access at the measurement date.

Level 2. Inputs, other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. Level 2 inputs include

1- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

2- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active;

3- observable inputs other than quoted prices for the asset or liability (for example, interest rates and yield curves); and

4- inputs derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or by other means.

Level 3. Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability. Unobservable inputs should be used to measure the fair value to the extent that observable inputs are not available.

When available, the Association measures fair value using level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. However, level 1 inputs are not available for all of the assets and liabilities that the organization is required to measure at fair value (for example in-kind contributions).

The primary uses of fair value measures in the Association's financial statements are:

I- Initial measurement of noncash gifts

II- recurring measurement of short term investments

4. INVESTMENTS

Investments consist of the following at June 30, 2017:

Short term investments: \$489,817

As discussed in Note 3 to these financial statements, the Association is required to report its fair value measurements in one of three levels, which are based on the ability to observe in the marketplace the inputs to the Association's valuation techniques. Level 1, the most observable level of inputs, is for investments measured at quoted prices in active markets for identical investments as of June 30, 2017. Level 2 is for investments measured using inputs such as quoted prices for similar assets, quoted prices for the identical assets in inactive markets, and for investments measured at net asset value that can be redeemed in the near future. Level 3 is for investments measured using inputs that are unobservable, and is used in situations for which there is little, if any, market activity for investments.

The Association uses the following ways to determine the fair value of its investments:

Money market funds: Determined by the published net asset value per unit at the end of the last trading day of the year, which is the basis for transactions at that date.

6. RETIREMENT PLAN

The Association participates in a defined contribution, individual account, money purchase, retirement plan that covers all employees who work over 20 hours per week.

In accordance with the plan agreement, the Association contributes 16.8 percent of the employee=s gross wages to the plan. During the years ended June 30, 2017 and 2016, the Association contributed \$112,540 and \$100,448 respectively, to the retirement plan.

7. OPERATING LEASES

The Association has an operating lease for its copier. Future minimum payments required by the lease are as follows:

8. CONCENTRATIONS OF RISK

Amounts held in financial institutions occasionally are in excess of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and Securities Investor Protection Corporation limits. The Association deposits its cash with high quality financial institutions, and management believes the Association is not exposed to significant credit risk on those amounts.

A significant portion of the Association=s annual funding comes from events and media for the programs operated.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 4, 2017, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Events occurring after that date have not been evaluated to determine whether a change in financial statements would be required.
